ESSA Proposed Timeline For Stakeholder Input

- Spring/Summer 2016 Analysis of ESSA to determine what changes are needed for Florida
- June/July 2016 Online public comment system open for input on what should be in Florida's state plan based on what ESSA says
- Summer/Fall 2016 State plan drafted
- TBD State plan posted for public comment for at least 30 days, prior to due date to USED
- No later than Summer 2017 State plan submitted to USED
- 2017-18 School Year ESSA implementation begins



(C) EXCEPTION FOR ADVANCED MATHEMATICS IN MIDDLE SCHOOL

This provision allows an exception only for grade 8 students who take an end-of-course (EOC) Mathematics assessment so that they do not have to be double tested on the grade-level mathematics assessment. Florida law provides this exception for all students that take high school EOCs so that they do not have to take the corresponding grade-level subject area assessment.
