- 1. How are both flexibility and student choices provided for the following **presentation features** in the instructional materials:
  - Fonts:
    - Type and size.
      - In PDF books, zoom function of Bookshelf can be used. In XML and EPUB books, fonts can be resized, but the typeface is fixed
    - Colors and background colors can be adjusted.
      - These can not be adjusted in PDF-based and EPUB books using Bookshelf, but are fully adjustable in XML books; however, these can be adjusted using Windows or OSX display settings (high contrast modes).
  - Background: High contrast color settings are available.
    - Bookshelf works well with the high-contrast modes in Windows or OSX. Book content is presented in high contrast along with the user interface.
  - Text-to-speech tools
    - Text-to-speech for book content is built into Bookshelf, or through using assistive technology like JAWS or VoiceOver.
  - All images have alt tags.
    - Alt text for images is not available in PDF-based books. Alt text descriptions are passed through Bookshelf to the user when available in XML and EPUB books.
  - All videos are captioned.
    - There are no videos present in PDF-based books.
  - Text, image tags, and captioning sent to refreshable Braille displays.
    - When available, text, image tags and captions are passed through to refreshable braille displays through the screen reading software.
- 2. How are the following **navigation features** provided in the instructional materials:
  - Non-text navigation elements (buttons, icons, etc.) can be adjusted in size.
    - User interface can be adjusted in size using a screen magnification program. Bookshelf has no built-in UI size adjustment.
  - All navigation elements and menu items have keyboard shortcuts.
    - *Most elements have shortcut keys associated with them. All elements can be navigated using the keyboard.*

- The menu bar, menus and menu items can be accessed using keyboard shortcuts and through the keyboard.
- All navigation information can be sent to refreshable Braille displays.
  - Navigation information available to the screen reading software is passed along to refreshable braille displays. Bookshelf exposes user interface information to the screen reader software.
- 3. How are the following **study tools** provided in the instructional materials:
  - Highlighters are provided in the four standard colors (yellow, rose, green, blue).
    - Yes, those colors and more are available.
  - Highlighted text can be automatically extracted into another document.
    - Yes, notes and highlights may be printed to an external document.
  - Note taking tools are available for students to write ideas online; as they are processing curriculum content.
    - Yes, note-taking is a key Bookshelf feature.
- 4. Which of the following **assistive technology supports, by product name,** have you tested for use with the instructional materials:
  - Assistive technology software can be run in the background. Examples include:
    - 1. Magnification:
      - Built-in book zoom and font size adjustment feature in Bookshelf.
      - Built-in browser magnification.
      - Zoom (Macintosh OS X 10.9 and iOS 7.1.2 and 8.0.2)
      - ZoomText (Windows)
    - 2. Text-to-speech
      - JAWS for Windows (v.15)
      - NVDA 2014.3
      - VoiceOver (Macintosh OS X 10.9 and iOS 7.1.2 and 8.0.2)
      - TalkBack (Android 4.4.3)
    - 3. Text-to-American Sign Language
      - 1. Have not been tested.
    - 4. On-screen keyboards
      - 1. Built-in Windows on-screen keyboard
      - 2. Mobile on-screen keyboard (iOS and Android)
    - 5. Switch scanning controls
      - 1. Have not been tested.
    - 6. Speech-to-text
      - 1. Have not been tested, but anticipate no issues because the speech-to-text is simply emulating keyboard access.
