






EPC received 148 suspensions.

## DISTRICTTRAINING EXAMPLE 1 INAPPROPRIATE PHYSICAL CONTACT

A 6<sup>th</sup> grade history T threw scissors at a S, pushed the S backward causing him to fall and then kicked the S, nudging the S to get up off the floor.

FEPC sanctioned the educator's certificate. However, the educator offered the following explanation:

T stated that the S was being disruptive and that a pair of scissors fell to the floor near his desk from a crate of supplies the T was carrying. T stated she did not intend to throw scissors at the S.

#### Reflection questions:

A S's disruptive behavior is often cited as a precursor to these types of physical encounters between Ts and Ss.

Have you considered scenario-based training for the educators in your school/district to help them practice responding to disruptive behavior?

Deliberate practice can offer specific takeaways for Ts to employ immediately.
