- <u>September 20, 2019 State Board reviews</u> proposed revisions for what will become the 2020-2025 Strategic Plan
- November 15, 2019 State Board adopts the 2020-2025 Strategic Plan



Goals of the Florida Education System Section 1008.31, Florida Statutes

- 1. Highest student achievement, as indicated by evidence of student learning gains at all levels.
- 2. Seamless articulation and maximum access, as measured by evidence of progression, readiness, and access by targeted groups of students identified by the Commissioner of Education.
- 3. Skilled workforce and economic development, as measured by evidence of employment and earnings.
- 4. Quality efficient services, as measured by evidence of return on investment.

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Current Metrics

 - Student Achievement on Florida Assessments
 - Continued Growth on Florida Assessments
 - Closing the Achievement Gap
 - High School Graduation Rate
 - High School Graduation Rate Plus (Acceleration)
 - Reducing the Percent of Low-Performing Schools
 - Postsecondary Completion Rate

- Goal 2 Seamless Articulation and Maximum Access
 - Postsecondary Continuation Rate
 - Associate Degree Articulation Rate
 - Access to High-Quality K-12 Educational Options
- Goal 3 Skilled Workforce and Economic Development
 - Postsecondary Employment Rate
 - Initial Wages
- Goal 4 Quality Efficient Services
 - Return on Investment
 - Agency Efficiency







Transition to 2020-2025: Ensuring Alignment With Aspirational Goals

Don't be Afraid to be Aspirational

- While Ambitious + Achievable is Good
- And Progress is Measured by Trend Lines
- Victory Isn't Measured by Trend Lines
- True Victory for a Student Occurs When All Doors are Open, All Achievement Gaps are Zero and All Possibilities are Endless



Goal 1: Highest Student Achievement

- Keep Existing Metrics
- Propose New Metrics Focusing on:
 - Early Learning
 - Kindergarten Readiness; % of High Performing Providers
 - Specific Grades/Subjects on Statewide Assessments
 - Grade 3 ELA; Civics EOC
 - NAEP
 - Detailed Breakdown of Achievement; Closing Achievement Gaps
 - School Improvement
 - Detailed Analysis of Title 1, D & F Schools
 - Reading
 - Progression to and Beyond Third Grade; Improvements for Lowest Performing 300 Schools
 - Great Teachers and Leaders Matter
 - Preparation; Recruitment; Retention; Performance; Compensation; etc.



Goal 2: Seamless Articulation and Maximum Access

- Keep Existing Metrics
- Propose New Metrics Focusing on:
 - Early Learning
 - Participation and Access
 - Participation and Access to Choice & Accelerated Courses/Programs
 - District Choice and Magnet programs; Open Enrollment; Charter Schools; Scholarship Programs; Career and Professional academies; Home Education; AICE Programs; Full- and Part-Time Virtual Instruction; IB Programs; Lab Schools; AP; Dual Enrollment; Collegiate HS; etc.





Goal 3: Skilled Workforce and Economic Development

- Keep Existing Metrics:
 - Breakdown Employment and Wage Data by Institution and Program

• Propose New Metrics Focusing on:

- Meaningful Accelerated Pathways
 - Performance in AP; IB; AICE; Dual Enrollment; High Quality Industry Certifications
- Meaningful CTE Pathways
 - Industry Certifications; Dual Enrollment; Pre-Apprenticeship and Apprenticeship
- Lumina's Ranking of Overall Working Age Adults with Postsecondary Credentials or High Quality Certifications
- Computer Science
 - Participation with Focus on Gender and Demographics



Goal 4: Quality Efficient Services

- Delete Existing Metrics
- Replace With New Metrics Focusing on:
 - Florida's ROI Compared Nationally:
 - K-12 Funding vs. Outcomes Such as NAEP, Quality Counts K-12 Achievement; ALEC; etc.
 - Florida's ranking on various key metrics, including:
 - High Quality Certifications/Credentials (e.g., Lumina)
 - Higher Education Quality and Cost
 - Conditions for Healthy Schools, Healthy Learning Environments:
 - Safe School Officer Coverage; Availability of Mental Health Services; Absenteeism; etc.
 - The Previously Mentioned Metrics for Teachers Also Apply Here




General Framework for Setting Targets

- Once the final metrics are agreed upon, trend data (if available) will be pulled so that targets can be proposed. The following framework for setting targets is recommended:
 - Red Target: <u>Time Trend Goal</u> Growth/improvement follows historical trend
 - Yellow Target: <u>Ambitious, yet Achievable Goal</u> Growth/improvement beyond historical trend
 - Green Target: <u>Aspirational Goal</u> Growth/improvement significantly beyond historical trend



Example: Percent of Third Graders Scoring at Grade-Level or Above



Red Target: <u>Time Trend Goal</u> – 65% by 2025, based on historical growth (~1% per year) **Yellow Target**: <u>Ambitious, yet Achievable Goal</u> – 72% by 2025, based on double the historical growth **Green Target**: <u>Aspirational Goal</u> – 90% by 2025, the aspirational goal
