


Florida Department of Education's (FDOE) Mission and Vision

English Language Learners (ELLs) in Florida




ELLs in Florida Survey 3 2022-2023

Basic ESOL – instruction in English/Language Arts, regardless of delivery model approach.

Basic Subject Areas – instruction in computer literacy, mathematics, science, and social studies.

ELLs: Instructional Model – the type of instructional strategy provided to ELLs in each course. The allowable types of instructional models are:

- Sheltered English
- Sheltered Core/Basic Subject Areas
- Mainstream English
- Mainstream– Core/Basic Subject Areas
- Maintenance or Developmental Bilingual Education

Graded public schools identified for support and intervention by the Department because the school earned a grade of "D," and grade of "F" or produced a graduation rate of sixty-seven (67) percent or less. (Rule 6A-1.099811, F.A.C.)

School Improvement Overview

Turnaround Schools

Graded public schools that are in Tier 2 or 3 of School Improvement.


- **Tier 2 SI school:** Any school that earns a single grade of "F" or consecutive grades of "D" in any school year in which the school received a grade and is in the first cycle of turnaround. (Rule 6A-1.099811, F.A.C.)
- Tier 3 SI school: Any school that has completed one or more cycles of turnaround and has not improved its grade to at least a "C." (Rule 6A-1.099811, F.A.C.)


