Ongoing School Activities	Reading Challenge: 1-5: The class with the most AR points for the grade level will win a cookie party. K/ESE: Each student will be provided a reading log to log the number of books read at home during the week. Each class whose students read at least three books each will win a prize. (i.e. If there are 18 students in the class, the class total will be 54. If the class has 10 students, the total will be 30.) Bookmark contest: Students will be provided with a bookmark blank to design according to the theme. K-2 and 3-5 each will have a 1 st , 2 nd , & 3 rd place winner who will receive prizes. The winning bookmarks will be duplicated and used in the library as well as displayed on a library poster. 
