JUNE 2013 QUARTERLY REPORT

The John M. McKay Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program parents of students allows with disabilities to choose the best academic environment for their children. This program provides eligible students opportunity to attend a participating private school or transfer to another public school. Eligible students include students who have been issued an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or a 504 Accommodation Plan that is effective for more than 6 months.

This report contains private school and student statistics for the September 2012, November 2012, February 2013, and April 2013 payment periods of the 2012-2013 school year. Percentages are rounded.





McKay Enrollment by Gender





McKay Enrollment by Grade Level






McKay Race/Ethnicity





Private School by Type Participating in McKay Scholarship Program




McKay Enrollment by Type of Private School



McKay Student Enrollment by Type





IEP Student Enrollment by Primary Exceptionality





IEP Student Enrollment by Gender





IEP Student Enrollment by Grade Level






IEP Student Race/Ethnicity



504 Student Enrollment by Gender






