## NOVEMBER 2012 QUARTERLY REPORT

The John M. McKay Scholarships for
Disabilities Program allows parents of students with
disabilities to choose the best academic environment for their
children. This program provides eligible students the
opportunity to attend a participating private school or transfer
to another public school. Eligible students include students
who have been issued an Individualized Education Plan (IEP)
or a 504 Accommodation Plan that is effective for more than 6
months.

This report contains private school and student statistics for the September 2012 and November 2012 payment periods of the 2012-2013 school year. Percentages are rounded.
