The John M. McKay Scholarships for Students with Disabilities allows Program parents of students with disabilities to choose the best academic environment for their children. This program provides eligible students opportunity to attend a participating private school or transfer to another public school. Eligible students include students who have been issued an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or a 504 Accommodation Plan that is effective for more than 6 months.

This report contains private school and student statistics for the September 2011, November 2011, February 2012, and April 2012 payment periods of the 2011-2012 school year.





Private Schools by Type Participating in McKay Scholarship Program




McKay Student Enrollment by Type of Private School



McKay Student Enrollment by Type





IEP Student Enrollment by Primary Exceptionality





IEP Student Enrollment by Gender





IEP Student Enrollment by Grade Level






IEP Student Race/Ethnicity



504 Student Enrollment by Gender






