This report contains private school and student statistics for the September, November, and February payment periods of the 2009-2010 school year.





McKay Student Enrollment by Gender





McKay Student Enrollment by Grade Level





McKay Student Eligiblility for Free and Reduced-Price





McKay Student Racial/Ethnic Enrollment








