This report contains private school and student statistics for the September, November, February, and April payment periods of the 2008-2009 school year.





McKay Student Enrollment by Gender





McKay Student Enrollment by Grade Level



McKay Student Eligiblility for Free and Reduced-Price





McKay Student Enrollment by Primary Exceptionality






