## JUNE QUARTERLY REPORT 2008


#### Abstract

The John M. McKay Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program allows parents of students with disabilities to choose the best academic environment for their children. Parents have the option of choosing another public school or applying for a scholarship for their child to attend an eligible private school. Over the past few years, thousands of parents have chosen the McKay Scholarship Program for their children's education.


This quarterly report also represents the final annual report for the McKay Scholarship Program for the 2007-08 school year. It includes cumulative private school and student statistics for the September 2007, November 2007, February 2008, and April 2008 payment periods.
