#### Abstract

The John M. McKay Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program allows parents of students with disabilities to choose the best academic environment for their children. Parents have the option of choosing another public school or applying for a scholarship for their child to attend an eligible private school. Over the past few years, thousands of parents have chosen the McKay Scholarship Program, making this the largest and fastest growing scholarship program in Florida.
