# **John M. McKay Scholarship Program**

## **September 2021 Quarterly Report**

The John M. McKay Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program allows parents of students with disabilities to choose the best academic environment for their children. This program provides eligible students the opportunity to attend a participating private school or transfer to another public school. Eligible students include students who have been issued an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or a 504 Accommodation Plan that is effective for more than 6 months.

This report contains private school and student statistics for the September 2021 payment period of the 2021-22 school year. All student participant numbers presented in the report reflect those who have received funding for the McKay scholarship program. Students who were enrolled in McKay but did not receive funding (i.e. unenrolled from program, change of program) are not reflected in this report. Percentages are rounded.

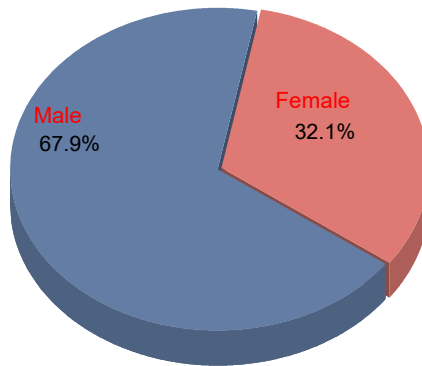

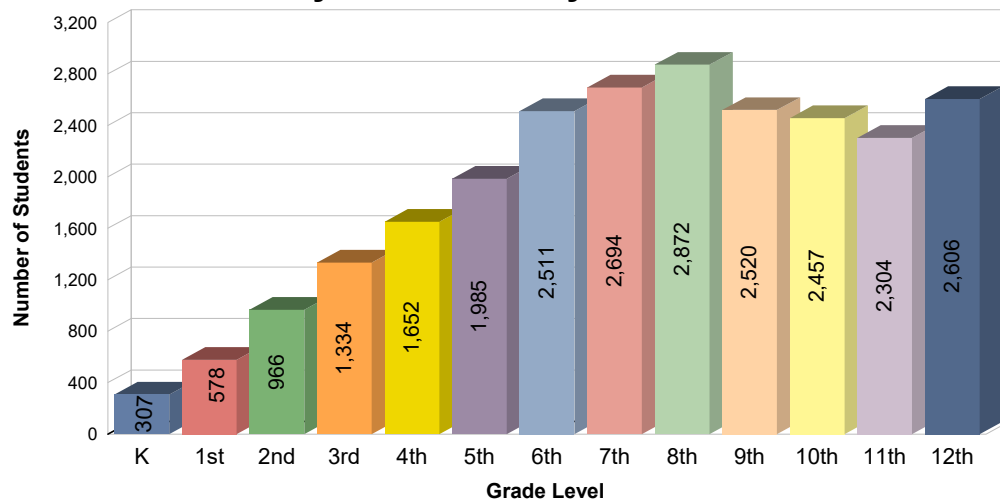

## McKay Enrollment by Gender



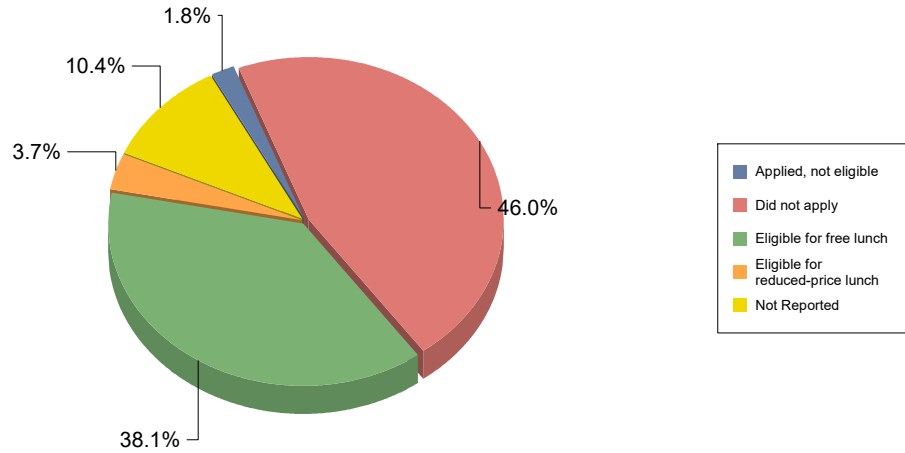

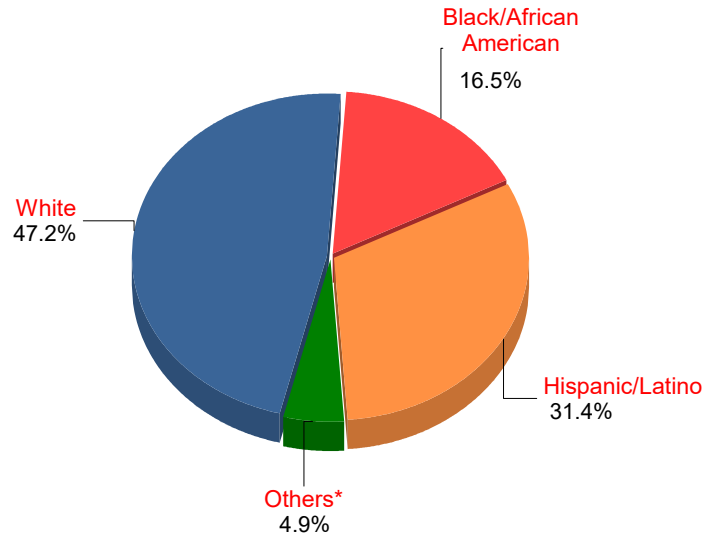

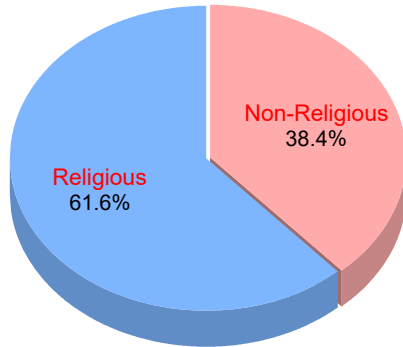

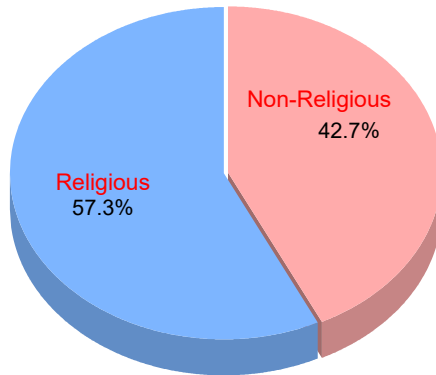

## Private School by Type Participating in McKay Scholarship Program

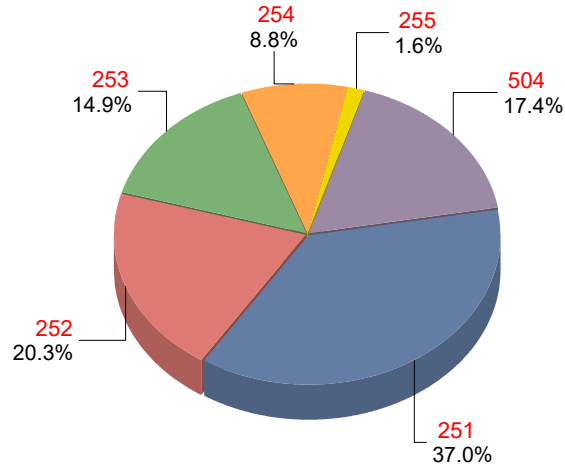

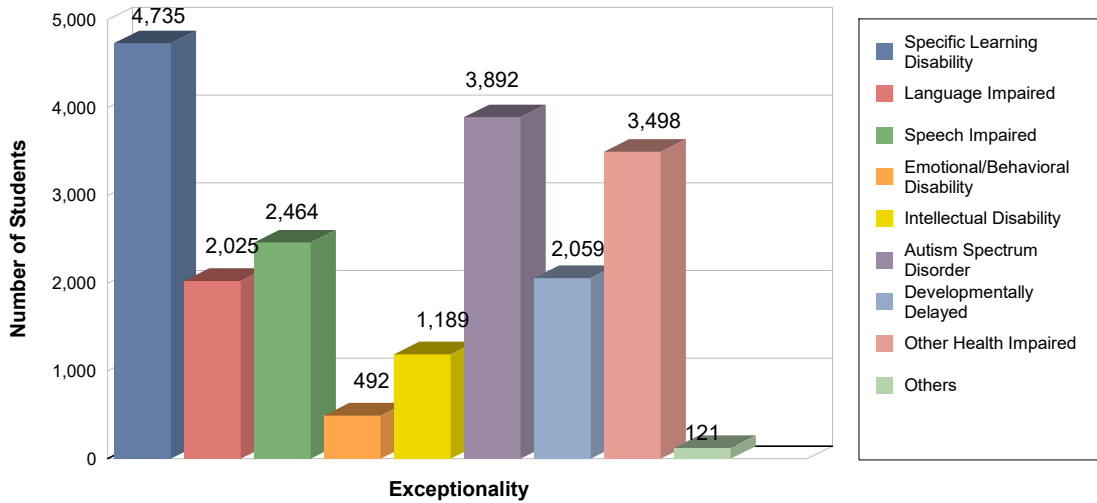

## McKay Student Enrollment by Type



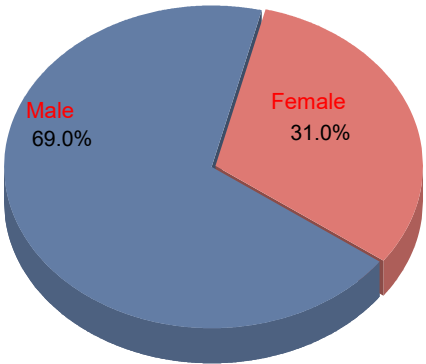

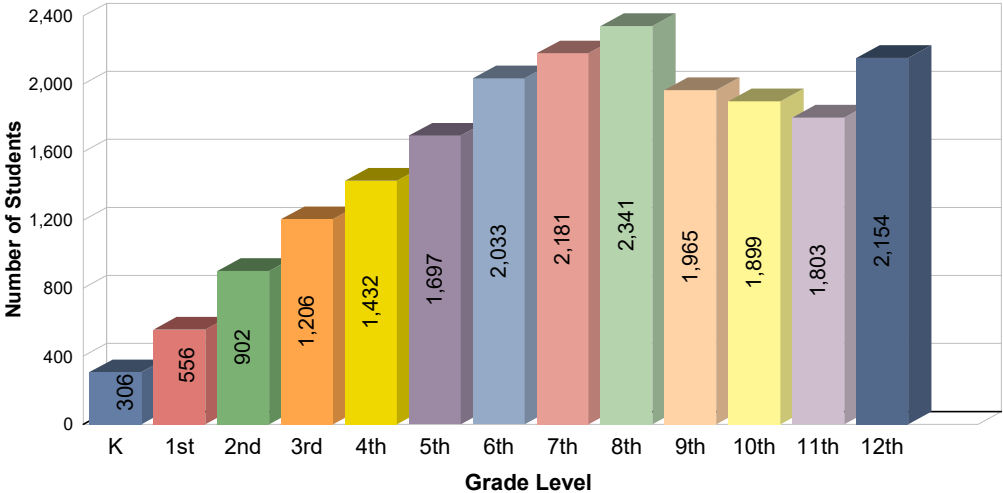

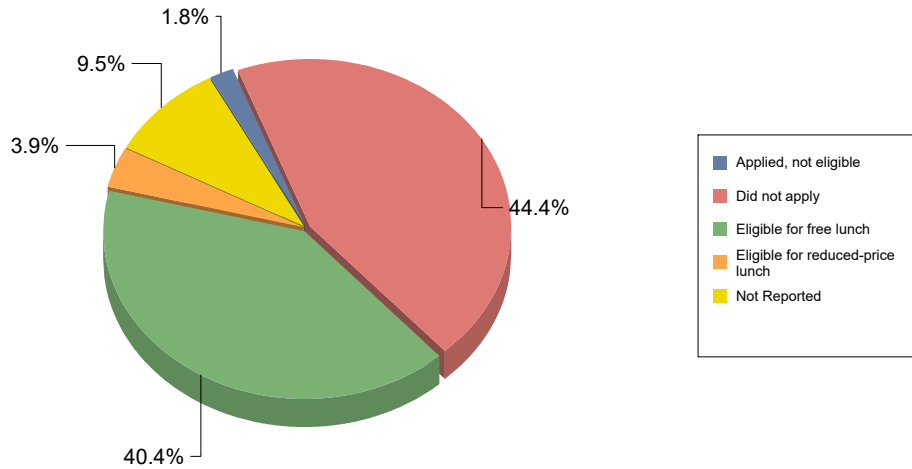

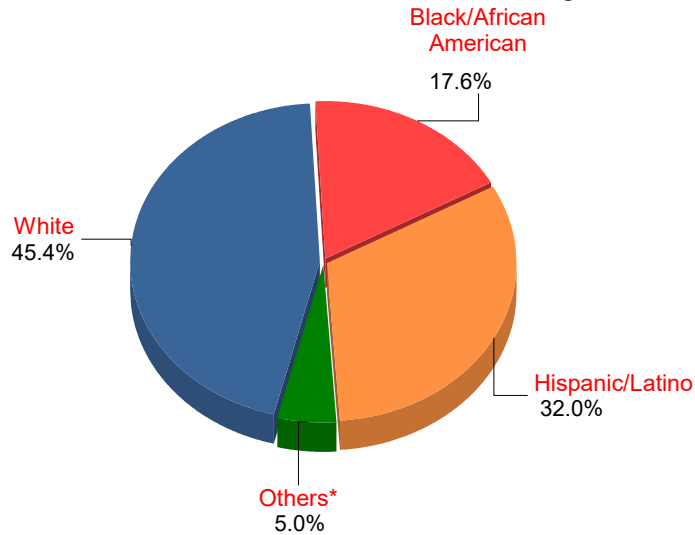

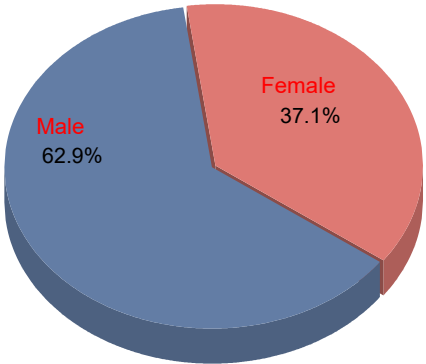

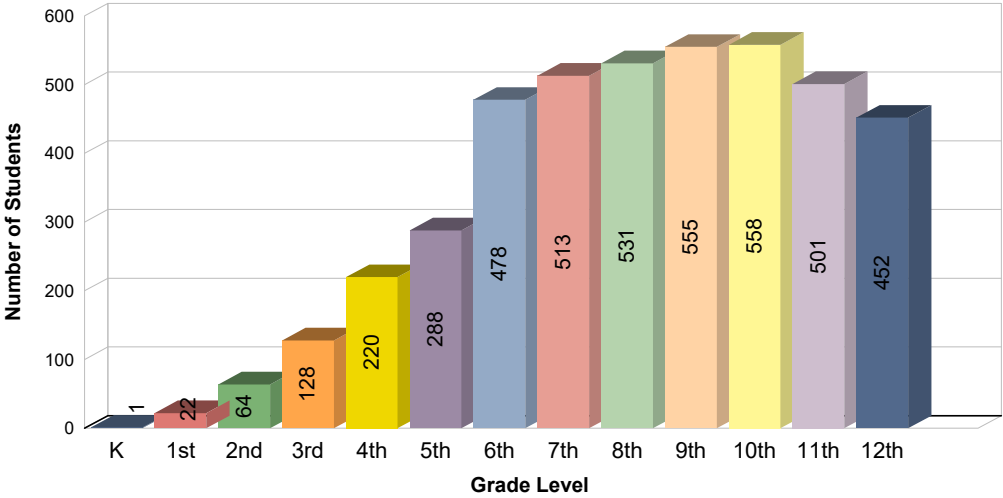

### 504 Student Enrollment by Gender



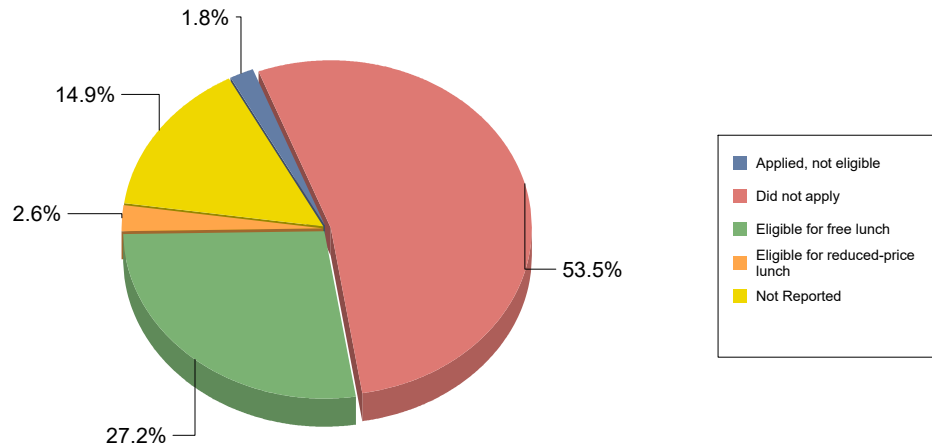

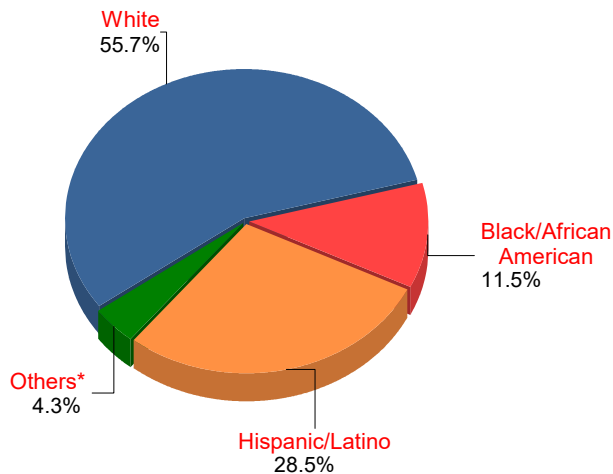
