1. Sections 22 and 23 of Chapter 2012-133, Laws of Florida, reduced the Base Student Allocation (BSA) reduction to non-compliant districts and charter schools from 100% of the allocation to 50% of the allocation.

2. Pursuant to s. 1003.3(4)(d), F.S., the Commissioner must prepare an allocation of the funds made available for the districts that have fully met the class size requirement. The funds shall be reallocated by calculating an amount up to 5 percent of the Base Student Allocation multiplied by the total district FTE students. The reallocation total may not exceed 25 percent of the total funds reduced.

3. Pursuant to s. 1003.3(4)(e), F.S., for districts that submit to the Commissioner by February 15 a plan certified by the district school board, the funds remaining after the reallocation in Column 3 shall be added back to the district's class size categorical allocation based on each qualifying district's proportion of the total reduction for all qualifying districts for which a reduction was calculated.
