SUBJECT: Allocation of Performance-based Incentive Funds for Industry Certification Attainment from Specific Appropriation 120 from the 2021 General Appropriations Act (GAA)

The Florida Department of Education has completed the allocation of the postsecondary performancebased incentive funds for industry certification attainment that are provided in Specific Appropriation 120 from the 2021 General Appropriations Act (<u>Chapter 2021-36, Laws of Florida</u>). The following statutory guidelines are specified for the distribution of these funds for performance-based incentives:

Funds in Specific Appropriation 120 shall be provided by the Department of Education to district workforce education programs for students who earned industry certifications during the 2020-2021 academic year. Funding shall be based on students who earned industry certifications in the following occupational areas: health science to include surgical technology, orthopedic technology, dental assisting technology, practical nursing, medical coder/biller, medical assisting, certified nursing assistant, emergency medical technician and paramedic, clinical lab technician, EKG technician, pharmacy technician, and clinical hemodialysis technician; automotive service technology; auto collision repair and refinishing; medium/heavy duty truck technician; marine engine repair; cyber security; cloud virtualization; network support services; computer programming; computer-aided drafting; advanced manufacturing; electrician; plumbing; public safety; welding; Federal Aviation Administration airframe mechanics and power plant mechanics; and heating, ventilation and air conditioning technician. These performance funds shall not be awarded for certifications earned through continuing workforce education programs.

School districts shall maintain documentation for student attainment of industry certifications that are eligible for performance funding. The Auditor General shall verify compliance with this requirement during scheduled operational audits of the school districts. If a district is unable to comply, the district shall refund the performance funding to the state.

The performance funding allocation is disbursed in two payments to the districts. The first payment is October 26, 2021 and the second payment is scheduled for April 2022. Section 1011.80 (6)(b), Florida Statutes, provides that "Each school district shall be provided \$1,000 for each industry certification earned by a workforce education student."

The attached document provides a summary of the performance-based incentive funds that will be disbursed to districts during the 2021-22 fiscal year. The report summarizes the total funded industry certifications and the allocation provided for each school district. Note the payment amounts for October and April in columns 3 and 4 of the table.

Districts have access to student level reports that provide information on the students and certifications that generated the incentive funds. To access the file, log into TIBCO and access the file in the PERA/Out folder. The files are available in your District PERA TIBCO folder with the following file name: DISTx or DISTxx._FUNDED_CERTS_2021.XLS where the x or xx indicates your actual district number. The file format is as follows:

<u>The student level file will be placed in the TIBCO folder on Wednesday, November 17</u>. <u>The</u> placement in this location is temporary. <u>Your assigned district staff must retrieve this file within</u> <u>seven (7) business days after placement of the file.</u> Upon receipt of this communication, please immediately take action to download this file.

If you are not familiar with the TIBCO process, please contact your local staff. Please review these student level reports to ensure that your district has correctly reported industry certifications that were eligible for funding. If your district has received funds for certifications that should not have been funded, please contact Tara Goodman at <u>tara.goodman@fldoe.org.</u>

Summary reports are also available to districts. The Division of Career and Adult Education will provide a report to each district with information on the funded certifications by certification code and category, upon request of the district. Please contact Audrey Kervin at <u>audrey.kervin@fldoe.org</u> to request a report.
