On September 15th, the Department of Education announced the release of the application for the Open Door Grant Program. Established through House Bill 1507, Chapter No. 2021-164, Laws of Florida, the Open Door Grant Program provides \$35 million in appropriations, with \$20 million appropriated for Florida College System institutions and \$15 million for district postsecondary technical colleges/career centers. The first review date will be **October 15, 2021**. Applications will continue to be accepted until November 1, 2021, or until all appropriated funds are awarded, whichever comes first.
