Position Available at the Partnership for Effective Programs for Students with Autism (PEPSA) PEPSA, a discretionary project of the Bureau of Exceptional Education and Student Services (BEESS), is currently seeking to fill its full-time, program planner analyst position. The program planner analyst is a professional who promotes, develops, coordinates and evaluates activities and services provided by PEPSA through the FDOE. This individual participates in the management of training events, program information dissemination, communication with the participants and partnering Center for Autism and Related Disabilities sites, coordinating participant travel reimbursement, and compiling and maintaining project-related data for the analysis and evaluation of program effectiveness, and other duties as assigned. At a minimum, this position requires a bachelor's degree in a field directly related to the program's responsibilities and two years of professional experience; or a master's degree in an area of specialization appropriate for the program. The preferred candidate will have a bachelor's degree in education or business administration and two years of professional experience; or a master's degree in education and one year of professional experience. #### STEM Academy for High School Students who are Deaf and Hard of Hearing

The <u>National Technical Institute for the Deaf (NTID) Regional STEM [Science, Technology,</u> <u>Engineering and Mathematics] Center</u> invites Florida high school students who are deaf or hard of hearing and aged 15 through 21, to apply for the STEM Academy.
