Are Florida College System Baccalaureate Program Enrollments Growing?

Yes. Baccalaureate program enrollments in the Florida College System (FCS) are at an all time high level. The number of students enrolled in baccalaureate programs in FCS institutions reached a record level of 30,515 in 2012-13. Over the last five years headcount enrollments have nearly quadrupled (grew 3.8 times). Students mostly participate in baccalaureate programs part-time often due to career or family responsibilities. Full-time-equivalent (FTE) calculations convert the part-time students to full-time status. The annual FTE figure reflects the total credit hours being taken by all students divided by 30, which is the number of semester hours traditionally considered a full-time class load. Over the last five years FTE enrollments more than tripled from 3,521 in 2008-09 to 11,399 in 2012-13 (grew 3.2 times).

of the time publication, 24 of 28 **FCS** colleges were authorized to offer 168 baccalaureate programs. The most popular programs based enrollments appear in Table 2. For 2012-13. supervision management enrolled over 11.000 students.

Nursing had almost 4,500 enrollments, education enrollments were over 3,600 while other majors that had over 1,000 enrollments include public safety administration, business administration, and health service administration.

Overall, Bachelor of Applied Science (BAS) programs that are workforce-related for regional needs account for most enrollments (17,840). Examples of BAS programs include cardiopulmonary science, clinical laboratory science, and public safety administration. Bachelor of Science (BS) programs in areas such as general biology, engineering technology or financial services had over 4,579 enrollments in 2012-13. Nursing programs were fourth overall (4,470 enrollments) and education programs enrolled 3,626 students for the same year.

Table 3 identifies colleges with 10 or more approved baccalaureate programs in 2012-13. St. Petersburg College which was the first FCS institution to offer baccalaureate programs has 25 programs from which students can choose. Following close behind are Indian River State College (17), Miami Dade College (16), and Florida State College at Jacksonville (14). Daytona State College and Broward College both offer 11 programs and Chipola College and Edison State College each has 10 programs. With a total of 24 colleges offering a variety of baccalaureate programs, students
