Program Overview

- Title IX, Part A Education of Homeless Children and Youth is prescribed under Title IX, Part A of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).
- FMVP's overall goal:
 - Address the problems that homeless children and youth face in enrolling, attending and succeeding in school and ensure each homeless child and youth has equal access to the same free, appropriate public education, including a public preschool education, as other children and youth.



FMVP Eligibility

- A student eligible for McKinney-Vento Act (MVA) services lacks a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence.
- Nighttime residency examples include:
 - Shelters;
 - Shared housing ("doubled up");
 - Unsheltered (cars, parks, public spaces, bus or train stations);
 - Motels/hotels; and
 - Migratory children living in a circumstance described above.





FMVP Education Goals


- All Florida local educational agencies (LEAs) consistently will:
 - Identify at least 5% of their Free and Reduced-Price Lunch (FRPL) enrollment as homeless in a school year;
 - Achieve at least a 90% school attendance rate for students identified as homeless in a school year; and
 - Promote at least 90% of students identified as homeless in a school year to the next grade at the end of each year.




McKinney-Vento Population 2018-2023

Rule 6A-10.088, F.A.C., Florida McKinney-Vento Program Training and Identification



Rule Overview

- Approved by the State Board of Education on July 2023 and effective August 22, 2023
- This rule addresses the process for:
 - The identification of children and youth experiencing homelessness using a Student Housing Questionnaire
 - Training of district and school staff
 - Required reporting through the Florida Department of Education (FDOE) Comprehensive Management Information System

Rule 6A-10.088, F.A.C. Section 3 – School District Procedures

• District must adopt procedures that include requirements in the rule.



Rule 6A-10.088, F.A.C. Section 4 – District McKinney-Vento Liaisons

- Requires school districts to designate a McKinney-Vento (MV) liaison.
- Outlines the duties of a MV liaison.
- Requires participation in training and provision of training to appropriate district and school staff.



Section 4 – District McKinney-Vento Liaisons: Training

- MV liaisons must participate in at least two training courses each school year provided or recommended by the FDOE.
- School districts must identify district- and school-level personnel who must participate in training provided by the MV liaison.
- School districts must maintain documentation of liaison training.



Rule 6A-10.088, F.A.C. Section 5 - Student Housing Questionnaire

- School districts must create Student Housing Questionnaires (SHQs).
- SHQs must be disseminated once each school year and must be included in school enrollment packet.
- The effective date for SHQ required elements is July 1, 2024.
- School districts may include additional elements.



Rule 6A-10.088, F.A.C. Section 6 - Required Reporting

- By August 1 of each year, school districts must report MV liaison contact information on Form FMP-1.
- School districts must report information on students experiencing homelessness to the Department during its scheduled survey periods.

FMVP Data Element: Homeless Unaccompanied Youth

- C Certified by the school district homeless liaison as a "Certified Unaccompanied Homeless Youth."
- N Identified as homeless student but does not meet definition of unaccompanied.
- U Meets definition of unaccompanied, but not certified.
- Z Does not meet definition of homeless or unaccompanied.



Florida McKinney-Vento Policies and Provisions



Florida McKinney-Vento Policies and Provisions

Certified Unaccompanied Homeless Youth [s. 743.067, Florida Statutes (F.S.)]

- 16 years of age or older; and not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian, including a youth who has run away from home, who has been forced to leave his or her home, or whose parents have left the area and left the youth behind
- Eligible for free state identification card, birth certificate and access to medical services without a legal parent/guardian

Florida Tuition and Fee Exemptions [s. 1009.25(1)(e), F.S.]

- Eligible for tuition and fee exemptions at public technical schools, public colleges and state universities
- Eligible to anyone verified as homeless by authorized individuals
