## The Corporate Tax Credit (CTC) Program

The Corporate Tax Credit (CTC) Scholarship Program was established to encourage private, voluntary contributions from corporate donors to non-profit scholarship funding organizations that award scholarships to children from low-income families. A corporation can receive a dollar-for-dollar tax credit up to $75 \%$ of its state income tax liability, and the state may award a maximum of $\$ 88$ million in credits each year. This program expands educational opportunities and school choice for children of families that have limited financial resources.

## Summary of the June 2007 CTC Quarterly Report

The June CTC Quarterly Report is also considered the annual report because it is based on the cumulative data submitted by the Scholarship Funding Organizations (SFO) for students who participated in the CTC Scholarship Program at any point during the 2006-2007 school year. This report is the first one to include scholarship payment information for CTC students.

In 2006-2007, three Scholarship Funding Organizations awarded a total of just over \$59.3 million in scholarships to 17,819 students enrolled in 948 participating Florida private schools.

The 17,819 students in 2006-2007 is an increase of 3,758 students over the 2005-2006 student totals as reported in the June 2006 CTC Quarterly Report. This represents an enrollment increase of $26.7 \%$. In addition, the number of private schools participating (948) represents a $5.9 \%$ increase over the 895 private schools that participated during the 2005-2006 school year.

The top 5 districts together enrolled more than $60 \%$ of CTC students and received almost $\$ 37.2$ million scholarship funding (more than $60 \%$ of the total funded): Dade ( $25.5 \%$ ), Orange (15.1\%), Duval (11.6\%), Broward (5.9\%), and Hillsborough (4.6\%).

Some characteristics of the CTC student data include:

- Slightly more female students (51\%) participate in the CTC program than male students (49\%).
- The lower grade levels tend to have the larger student enrollments. Students enrolled in Kindergarten through Grade 3 make up 51\% of the scholarship recipients.
- The racial/ethnic breakdown reflects the diversity of students utilizing the CTC scholarship, which includes:

Black students (40\%)
Hispanic students (24\%)
White students (23\%)
Other students (13\%)
