Scholarship Program

NOVEMBER 2012 QUARTERLY REPORT

The Florida Credit (FTC) Tax Scholarship Program established in 2001 to encourage private, voluntary contributions non-profit from corporate donors to scholarship fundina organizations (SFO) that award scholarships to children from low-income families. Step Up For Students is the only approved participating SFO for the 2012-13 school year. A corporation can receive a dollar-for-dollar tax credit up to 100% of its state income tax liability. The program also includes credits against the insurance premium tax for contributions to eligible non-profit SFOs, credits against severance taxes on oil and gas production, self-accrued sales tax liabilities of direct pay permit holders, and alcoholic beverage taxes on beer, wine, and spirits. The maximum amount the state may award is \$229 million in credits for the 2012-2013 This program expands educational opportunities and school choice for children of families that have limited financial resources.





FTC Student Enrollment by Gender





FTC Student Enrollment by Grade Level






FTC Student Enrollment by Type of Private School
