The student is or was the subject of a shelter proceeding, a dependency proceeding, or a termination of parental rights proceeding, and who: is, or was at the time of the reaching 18 years of age, in out-of-home care, rather than in the custody of the Department of Children and Families (DCF) as is provided for in current law; was adopted from DCF after May 5, 1997; or was placed in a permanent guardianship, regardless of whether the caregiver participates or participated in the Relative Caregiver Program under s. 39.5085, F.S., and remains in such guardianship until either the student reaches 18 years of age or, if before reaching 18 years of age, enrolls in an eligible institution. (s. 1009.25(1)(d), F.S.)

Note: Effective July 1, 2022, the fee exemptions related to the Department of Children and Families were significantly revised. Effective for Fall reporting, a population that was previously reported under value O must now be reported under value 3. Value 3 also includes an additional exemption that was added during the 2022 legislative session for dependent children placed in permanent guardianship under s. 39.6221, F.S. This table value reflects how the Department of Children and Families measures be exemptions granted to children placed in custody of relatives or non-relatives.
