Assessment of IELCE Grant Implementation

- In the Spring, the Department will be conducting a review of all providers implementing IELCE programming with funds available under section 243.
- Providers will be required to complete an assessment to provide evidence of meeting the program requirements as specified in law and regulation.

What is IET?

Integrated Education and Training (IET) is the integration of adult education basic skills curriculum with occupational skills training curriculum, to provides a cohesive and seamless instructional experience for students based on a single set of learning objectives.





Components of IET

Goal of IET is to expand equitable access to skills training, stackable credentials and family supporting careers, particularly for those who have faced barriers to economic opportunity.



INTEGRATED EDUCATION AND TRAINING

"...a service approach that provides adult education and literacy activities concurrently and contextually with workforce preparation activities and workforce training for a specific occupation or occupational cluster for the purpose of educational and career advancement" (Final WIOA regulations at <u>34 CFR §463.35</u>).

 - In-person testing only, not available via Remote Proctoring/Public Browser access
 - NRS approval expected late in 2021 or early 2022
 - Applicable for Levels M, D or A.
 - One level, no Locator used
 - Fifteen Multiple Choice Questions
 - One Argumentative or Informative Essay
- TABE 11/12 Off-line
 - Initial Pilot starting February 1. Expanded pilot in Summer 2021
- TABE 11/12 HSE White Paper
 - Concordance Report on TABE to HSE tests
 - Posted to TABEtest.com Feb. 2021



- Updated from current forms A&B
- Seeking NRS approval Fall 2021
- TABE CLAS-E Reports and Data

Beyond Implementation Basics is under revision until July 1, 2021

• In the interim, CASAS recommends test administrators take the Implementation Basics Training for recertification

Reporting Students in Adult ESOL and ELCATE Starting PY 2020-2021

As of July 1, 2020:

Programs now report **two** Initial Educational Functioning Levels (EFL) for new enrollment students: Reading **and** Listening.

As of July 1, 2020:

Programs now track EFL gains and Literacy Completion Points (LCP) of students in **both** skill areas: Reading **and** Listening.

- Reporting will be conducted in a supplemental format for 2020-21 reporting. An Excel template will be provided for student level reporting of students participating in IET programming.
- 2020-21 Supplemental IET reporting will be due June 15, 2021

Status of Public GED Testing Centers

- November 1, 2020 January 31, 2021
 - 7,327 test takers took 16,654 tests
 - Approximately 30% of the tests were taken using OnVUE
 - In-person testing was available in 54 of the 59 counties in the state that operate public GED testing centers

GED® Testing – Vouchers

- GED[®] Testing/Pearson VUE vouchers are good for one year, so make sure to plan accordingly to only purchase what you will actually use in that time period. Here are a few tips to keep in mind:
 - Prior to ordering vouchers, plan out the number you will actually be able to use before they expire.
 - Monitor your inventory of current vouchers.
 - Have a plan in place for using your vouchers based on the expiration dates.
 - If you know you will be unable to use all of your vouchers by the expiration dates, contact us 4-6 weeks prior to expiration so that we can try to get them extended and/or reissued. (This is a last resort – plan accordingly to use your vouchers by the expiration date.)

2020-2021 WIOA – AEFLA Grants No Cost Extension to August 31, 2021

- FDOE Internal Process No Cost Extension
- All AEFLA Projects
 - Corrections Education (CE)
 - Integrated Literacy and Civics Education (IELCE)
 - Adult General Education (AGE)
- Agencies must spend funds only on allowable AEFLA activities
- If an agency elects to adjust their approved budget line items, then the agency must submit a Budget Amendment (through OMG Share file System)



2021-2022 WIOA – AEFLA Competitive Grants

- Expected release April 2021
- Competitive Grant application process
 - All AEFLA funds AGE, IELCE and CE
- Consolidated Grant Application
 - AGE and IELCE funds
- Two-years grant award cycle
 - 2021-2022 and 2022-2023
- Paperless application submission
