- o Round 2: \$160,000 in funding will be released in late Summer of 2021

## Grant Scope: Capacity building efforts, outreach and strategies to underrepresented populations

- Eligible applicants are Registered Apprenticeship Programs that registered or expanded into a new occupation on or after July 1, 2019 and are actively training apprentices fully registered with the Florida Department of Education.
