- 151 media hits reaching more than 18 million individuals
- **2,100+** social media mentions on Facebook, Instagram and Twitter reaching more than **11 million** individuals

Our digital advertising campaigns have also garnered more than **17.5 million** impressions resulting in an estimated **35,400** <u>unique</u> click throughs to the Get There website. From these, we connected over **10,000** residents to one of our 48 technical colleges or 28 Florida College System institutions. We recently launched the third phase of our campaign on May 17 and look forward to sharing results later this summer.
