Reminder to Return Books Borrowed from the Florida Instructional Materials Center for the Visually Impaired (FIMC-VI)

This is a reminder that all braille and large print books borrowed from FIMC-VI must be returned once the student no longer needs them. Returning these books allows FIMC-VI to recirculate them to another student.

- Returning 2020-2021 braille and large print textbooks: The teacher of the visually impaired should return books in boxes to FIMC-VI (4210 W. Bay Villa Avenue, Tampa, Florida 33611) via Free Matter for the Blind through the U.S. Postal Service. - Ordering for the 2021-2022 school year: To increase the likelihood that your students will have their braille or large print textbooks when school starts, those books should be ordered as soon as possible. An initial transcription from print to braille can take 90 days for the first chapters to be available and another 180 days or more for the book to be complete. This is especially important for the Fall 2021 English Language Arts (ELA)

adoptions. To expedite the braille purchasing process, please let FIMC-VI know what ELA curricula your district has selected. As soon as the ISBNs for the exact titles and grade levels are known, authorized personnel must order the braille and large print textbooks online at https://www.fimcvi.org/.
