Florida Instructional Materials Center for the Visually Impaired (FIMC-VI) Professional Development Opportunity

If you are an educator working with students who are blind or have a visual impairment, then this independent, self-paced training is for you. "What to Do if You Are Working with a Student Who is Blind or Visually Impaired" is specifically designed for teachers (e.g., classroom, physical education, music and art), therapists, and paraprofessionals who are new to the needs of students who are blind or have a visual impairment. However, any school-based personnel working with students with a visual impairment would benefit from completing these modules. The five modules include videos and other activities. Participants will earn up to five inservice credits at the discretion of their districts, which may be used toward the required 20 inservice points for recertification in teaching students with disabilities (Rule 6A-4.0051, Florida Administrative Code). Interested participants need to fill out the FIMC-VI Canvas Resource Site and Course Sign-Up form.
