#### Para-to-Teacher Support Program

Does your district or school have paraprofessionals who would make great special education teachers? The Para-to-Teacher Support Program is holding a virtual question-and-answer session on **September 28**, **2023**, at 6 p.m. ET (5 p.m. CT). Program Director, Dr. Keri Fogle will discuss funding opportunities for paraprofessionals who already hold at least an associate degree, the equivalent number of college credit hours, or a bachelor's degree in a noneducation field. The Para-to-Teacher Support Program is a state-funded grant program that has supported more than 200 paraprofessionals in earning their degrees to become special education teachers throughout Florida. ## Florida Instructional Materials Center for the Visually Impaired (FIMC-VI) and the Florida and Virgin Islands (FAVI) Deaf-Blind Collaborative Professional Learning Opportunities

The Impact of Deaf-Blindness on Learning and Development: FAVI and FIMC-VI have collaborated to create a self-paced, independent learning opportunity using materials developed by the National Center on Deaf-Blindness. These are professional learning modules for practitioners wanting to improve their knowledge of deaf-blindness and gain essential practical skills for working with students who are deaf-blind. The intended audience is teachers providing exceptional student education for students identified as having a visual impairment or who are deaf or hard of hearing, and those students with multiple disabilities, related service providers and administrators. Participants may earn 14 inservice credit hours if approved by the associated school district.

Braille Learning Community: A professional learning community for those serving students in Florida who wish to learn braille or improve their braille skills. This site includes a variety of literary and math braille resources to support and extend participants' knowledge of braille codes, including both Unified English Braille (UEB) Math and Science and UEB with Nemeth. Participants will have access to a discussion board for posting related questions and a board for sharing braille files. Veteran and certified braille transcribers are welcome to join to help others become more proficient. FIMC-VI staff members and a learning community of peers will support those completing literary and math UEB modules at <a href="UEB Online">UEB Online</a>. Participants may earn up to 50 inservice credit hours if approved by the associated school district.
