Statewide Meeting for Autism Spectrum Disorder District Contacts

The FDOE, Bureau of Exceptional Education and Student Services (BEESS), will be hosting a statewide meeting for autism spectrum disorder (ASD) district contacts on January 12, 2023, from 2 to 5 p.m. EST, in conjunction with the 2023 Center for Autism and Related Disabilities (CARD) Conference, which will be in Orlando on January 13-15, 2023. Travel funding for the designated district ASD contact (one per district) will be available from BEESS through the Partnership for Effective Programs for Students with Autism (PEPSA) by reimbursement. Reimbursement, registration and accommodation information will be provided to you by PEPSA. Please note that reimbursement will be paid directly to the participant and not to the district. If you choose to attend the PEPSA-Educator Day on January 13, 2023, and/or the CARD Conference on January 14-15, 2023, it is mandatory for you to attend the statewide meeting for reimbursement. If you are unable to attend, your district is encouraged to send another representative, possibly a school administrator who has students with ASD on campus. Please note, only one person from each district is eligible for reimbursement. If you plan to attend, contact Bryonka Clark at <u>bphilon@usf.edu</u>. All travel through PEPSA at the University of South Florida (USF) must have pre-approval. After you have submitted the USF PEPSA Travel Approval Request survey, you will be contacted by PEPSA once your approval has been processed.
