Florida Instructional Materials Center for the Visually Impaired (FIMC-VI) Annual Census Process

The FIMC-VI Info and Updates Part 2 webinar will be on **November 16, 2023**, and will address the steps for completing the Annual Census. The Annual Census will begin on **November 17, 2023**. Directors of ESE will receive an email with a username, password and instructions for accessing the online system to authorize district personnel to complete the Census. This first step of the process must be completed by **December 31, 2023**. **From January 1 to February 3, 2024**, the Census will be open for authorized district personnel (typically teachers of the visually impaired) to update student records. If you or your staff are unable to attend, the webinar will be recorded and posted on the <u>FIMC-VI's Past Events web page</u>. The Annual Census allows the State of Florida to calculate the number of legally blind students registered in school districts and receive funding from the Act to Promote the Education of the Blind. The Act to Promote the Education of the Blind authorizes an annual appropriation for the American Printing House for the Blind to produce and distribute educational materials adapted for students who are legally blind and enrolled in formal educational programs below the college level. The production and distribution of accessible instructional materials are done at no cost to the districts where students are registered. For more information about student eligibility, registration
