This site includes a list of cognitive and processing subtests to consider when assessing students with VIs, a risk list for combined vision and hearing loss, relevant webinars from the American Printing House for the Blind, materials available on loan from FIMC-VI, and a discussion board. Upon completing an optional quiz, participants may earn three inservice credit hours if approved by your school district. Restraint Data for October 2023 is Now Available

October 2023 data for restraint incidents submitted to the Involuntary Examination, Restraint, and Seclusion (known as IERS) web application is now available. The data have been posted to the Program Accountability, Assessment & Data Systems web page and can be located by scrolling down to the section titled "SWD Restraint Data – SY 2023-24," and selecting the appropriate month. Pursuant to section 1003.573(8), Florida Statutes, "The department shall maintain aggregate data of incidents of restraint and disaggregate the data for analysis by county, school, student exceptionality, and other variables, including the type and method of restraint used. This information shall be updated monthly, deidentified, and made available to the public through the department's website."
