FIMC-VI Professional Learning Opportunity—"What to Do if You Are Working with a Student Who is Blind or Visually Impaired"

If you are an educator working with a student who is blind or has a visual impairment, this independent, self-paced training is for you. "What to Do if You Are Working with a Student Who is Blind or Visually Impaired" is specifically designed for teachers (e.g., classroom, physical education, music and art); therapists; and paraprofessionals who are new to the needs of students who are blind or have a visual impairment. However, any school-based personnel working with students in this capacity would benefit from completing these modules. The five modules include videos and other activities. Participants will earn up to five in-service credits at the discretion of their district, which may be used toward the required 20 in-service points for recertification in teaching students with disabilities per Rule 6A-4.0051, Florida Administrative Code. SUBJECT: Guidance on Senate Bill 240 Practical Arts and Career and Technical Education Graduation Requirement Changes

Senate Bill (SB) 240 (2023) amended Section (s.) 1003.4282(3)(e), Florida Statutes (F.S.) and modified the options for a student to complete required credits to earn a standard high school diploma. The practical arts option in the required credit in fine or performing arts, speech and debate or practical arts was replaced with the option to complete one credit in career and technical education (CTE) to satisfy the required credit. This change is effective for the 2023-2024 school year. CTE courses that fulfill equally rigorous science (EQ), mathematics (MA), economics (EC) or personal financial literacy (PL) will continue to satisfy those subject area requirements for graduation purposes.

In August 2023, the State Board of Education approved the <u>Course Code Directory</u>, which now includes the new "CT" code. The "CT" code satisfies the one credit in fine or performing arts, speech and debate or CTE high school graduation requirement, pursuant to s. 1003.4282, F.S. The majority of grades 9-12 and 30-31 high school credit bearing CTE courses in section 5 of the Course Code Directory are coded as "CT," except those coded as EQ, MA, EC or PL. The 2023-24 curriculum frameworks were published in February 2023, several months prior to the passage of the legislation and still identify "PA" codes that were effective at the time. The 2024-25 curriculum frameworks will contain the necessary conforming changes. For now, we recommend you consult the Course Code Directory for information about subject area codes for CTE courses.

Finally, CTE courses taken prior to the 2023-24 school year may be counted to meet the one-credit graduation requirement. The 2023 amendment to s. 1003.4282, F.S., does not limit the CTE courses that can count toward graduation to only those taken after the amendment went into effect. The only exception to this would be CTE courses that were coded in prior years as EQ, MA and EC. Those courses fulfilled other subject area requirements for graduation purposes.
