Section 1. Background

During the 2021 legislative session, House Bill (HB) 233 amended sections (s.) 1001.03 and 1001.706, Florida Statutes (F.S.), to define the terms “intellectual freedom and viewpoint diversity” and “shield.” The bill also added a requirement for Florida College System (FCS) and State University System (SUS) institutions to conduct an annual assessment of intellectual freedom and viewpoint diversity.

Specifically, s. 1001.03(19), F.S., provides for the following:

The State Board of Education shall require each Florida College System institution to conduct an annual assessment of the intellectual freedom and viewpoint diversity at that institution. The State Board of Education shall select or create an objective, nonpartisan, and statistically valid survey to be used by each institution which considers the extent to which competing ideas and perspectives are presented and members of the college community, including students, faculty, and staff, feel free to express their beliefs and viewpoints on campus and in the classroom. The State Board of Education shall annually compile and publish the assessments by September 1 of each year, beginning on September 1, 2022. The State Board of Education may adopt rules to implement this paragraph.

To implement the provisions of s. 1001.03(19), F.S., two surveys were developed. The first survey was a 21-question multiple choice instrument whose audience was students. The second survey was a 24-question multiple choice instrument whose audience was employees. The two surveys were identical for the SUS and FCS. In this summary, the intellectual freedom and viewpoint diversity assessments for the FCS have been compiled for publication.

Section 2. Methodology

The two survey instruments were designed to assess the extent to which students and employees feel free to express their beliefs and viewpoints on campus and competing ideas are presented on campus. As shown in Appendix A, the Florida Department of Education’s (FDOE) Division of Florida Colleges (DFC) requested FCS institution assistance in disseminating the survey instruments to their student body and employee populations. Table 2.1 shows a timeline and key activities.

DFC used the web-based platform SurveyMonkey to create two institution-specific survey URLs: one for students and one for employees. On March 23, 2022, each chief academic officer and reports coordinator received an email containing the unique links with additional instructions for dissemination.

Each FCS institution identified the most appropriate student/employee notification system to disseminate the survey links. The notification system was required to provide a distinct count of recipients and reach the full population of students and employees, respectively.

On March 31, 2022, each FCS institution sent students and employees a pre-survey notification using DFC-provided language. On April 4, 2022, the survey URLs went live, and each FCS institution sent survey invitations using DFC-provided language. FCS institutions were required to send reminders to complete the surveys on April 7, 2022.

All FCS institutional responses to both instruments were submitted directly to DFC. Once the survey window closed on April 8, 2022, DFC closed the survey collector so no additional submissions were accepted. By April 15, 2022, each FCS institution provided additional information regarding the method of survey dissemination and estimated number of recipients.

Once the survey collectors closed, DFC staff extracted the data from SurveyMonkey and created a spreadsheet containing all the submissions. These data were reviewed for data quality and coded to facilitate data analysis. In total, responses from 7,213 students and 6,051 employees are compiled in this report.

Section 3. Student Responses

Table 3.1 shows student response rates by FCS institution. The most frequent method of distribution was via student email (n = 26). Of the more than 1.36 million individuals who received the student survey, 7,213 responded, representing a total response rate of 0.5 percent. By college, the minimum response rate was 0.1 percent and the maximum was 4.5 percent.

This section contains figures showing student responses to the 21-question survey instrument. Since respondents were able to skip questions, each figure is accompanied by a number of responses to that specific question.

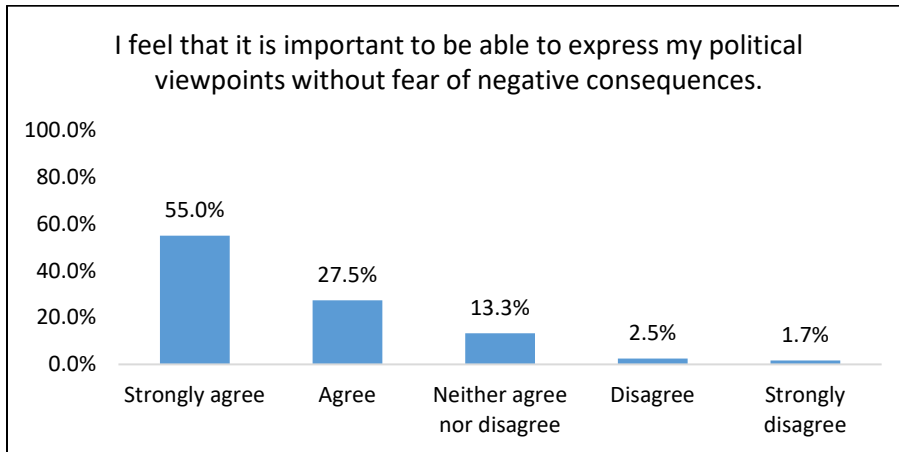


Figure 3.1. Question 1 Student Responses ($n = 7,187$)

Figure 3.1 shows student responses ($n = 7,187$) to the question, “I feel that it is important to be able to express my political viewpoints without fear of negative consequences.” In all, more than 82 percent of respondents agreed that it is important to be able to express political viewpoints without fear of negative consequences.

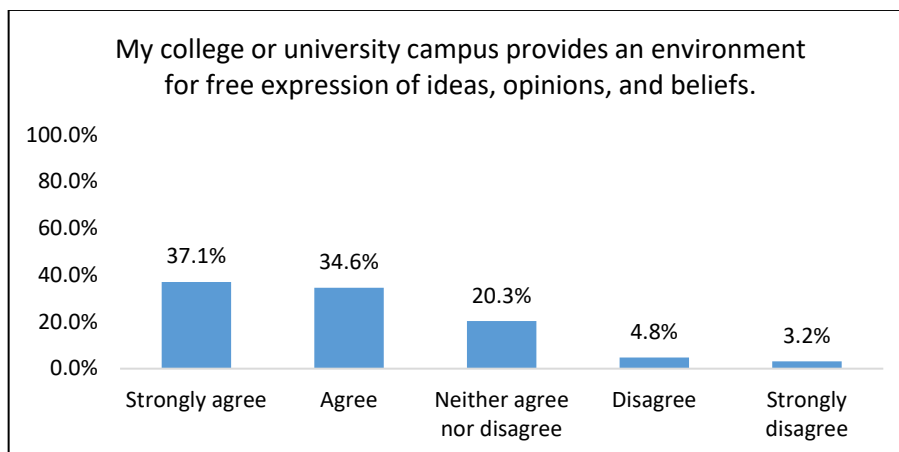


Figure 3.2. Question 2 Student Responses ($n = 7,162$)

Figure 3.2 shows student responses ($n = 7,162$) to the question, “My college or university campus provides an environment for free expression of ideas, opinions, and beliefs.” In all, about 72 percent of respondents agreed their campus provides an environment for free expression of ideas, opinions, and beliefs. Eight (8) percent of respondents disagreed, indicating their campus does not provide an environment for free expression. Roughly 20 percent neither agreed nor disagreed.

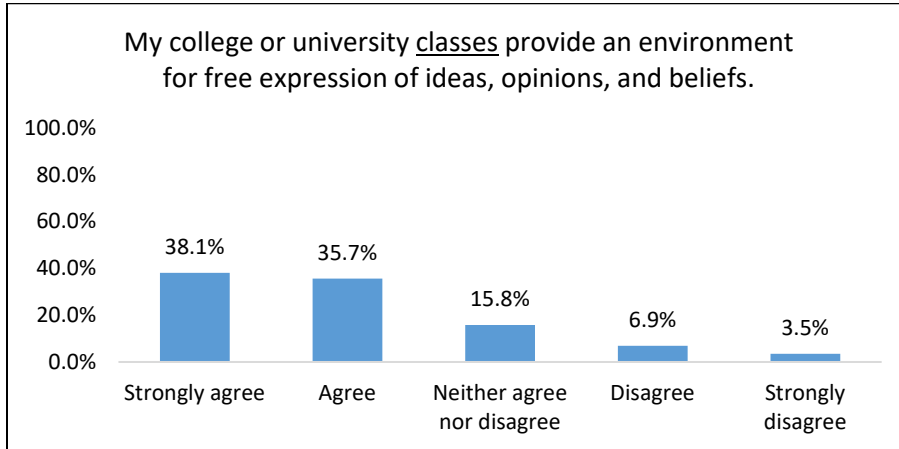


Figure 3.3. Question 3 Student Responses (n = 7,165)

Figure 3.3 shows student responses (n = 7,165) to the question, “My college or university classes provide an environment for free expression of ideas, opinions, and beliefs.” About 74 percent of respondents agreed their classes provide an environment for free expression of ideas, opinions, and beliefs. Ten (10) percent of respondents disagreed, indicating their classes do not provide an environment for free expression. Roughly 16 percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed.

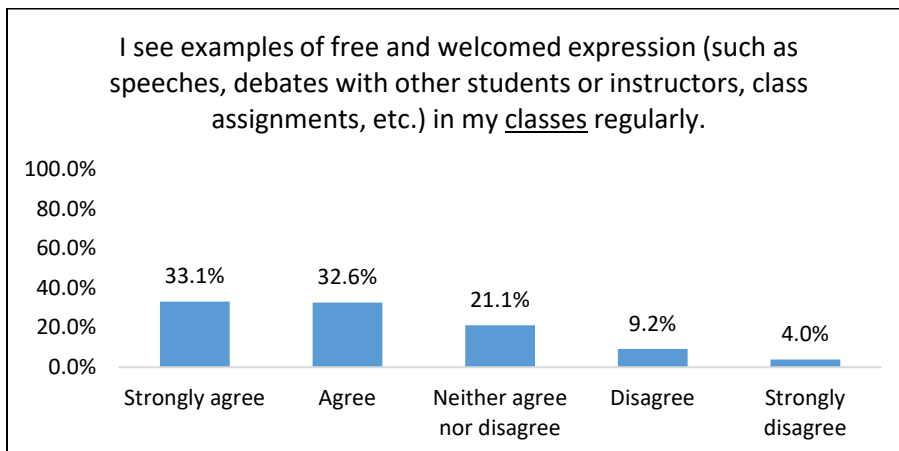


Figure 3.4. Question 4 Student Responses (n = 7,171)

Figure 3.4 shows student responses (n = 7,171) to the question, “I see examples of free and welcomed expression (such as speeches, debates with other students or instructors, class assignments, etc.) in my classes regularly.” Around 66 percent of respondents agreed they see examples of free and welcomed expression in classes regularly. About 13 percent of students disagreed that they see examples of free and welcomed expression in their classes, while about 21 percent neither agreed nor disagreed.

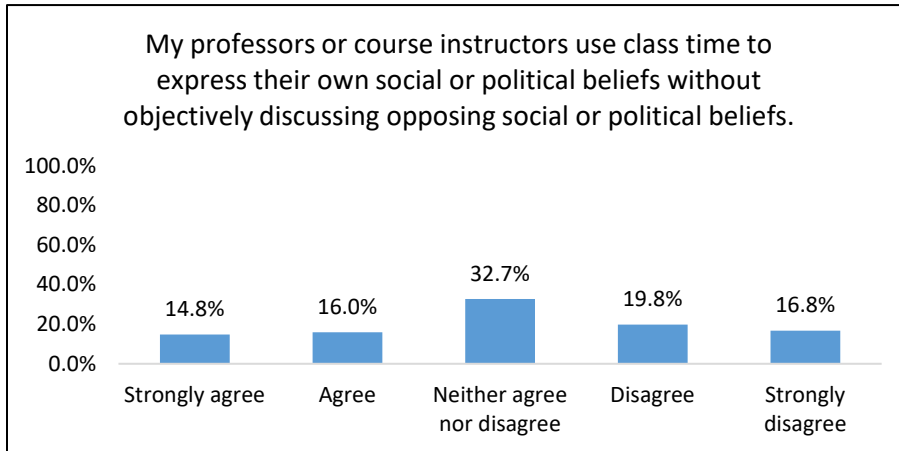


Figure 3.5. Question 5 Student Responses (n = 7,152)

Figure 3.5 shows student responses (n = 7,152) to the question, “My professors or course instructors use class time to express their own social or political beliefs without objectively discussing opposing social or political beliefs.” About 31 percent of respondents agree that their professors or course instructors use class time to express their own beliefs without objectively discussing opposing social or political beliefs, compared to about 36 percent of respondents who disagreed. About 33 percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed.

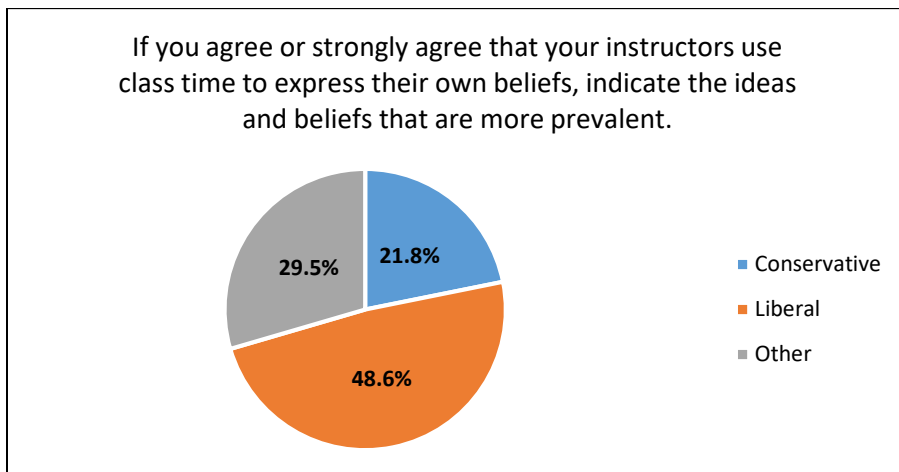


Figure 3.6. Question 6 Student Responses (n = 2,134)

Figure 3.6 shows student responses (n = 2,134) to the question, “If you agree or strongly agree that your instructors use class time to express their own beliefs, indicate the ideas and beliefs that are more prevalent.” About 49 percent of respondents who agreed or strongly agreed indicated that liberal beliefs were more prevalent, while about 22 percent indicated that conservative beliefs were more prevalent. Twenty-nine (29) percent of respondents indicated that other beliefs were more prevalent during class time.

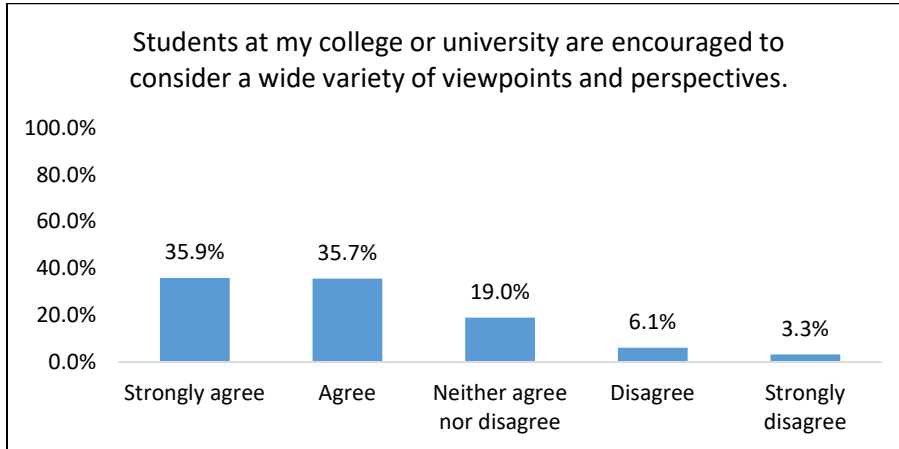


Figure 3.7. Question 7 Student Responses (n = 6,547)

Figure 3.7 shows student responses (n = 6,547) to the question, “Students at my college or university are encouraged to consider a wide variety of viewpoints and perspectives.” Around 72 percent of respondents agreed that they are encouraged to consider a wide variety of viewpoints and perspectives. About 9 percent of students disagreed that they are encouraged to consider a wide variety of viewpoints and perspectives, and 19 percent neither agreed nor disagreed.

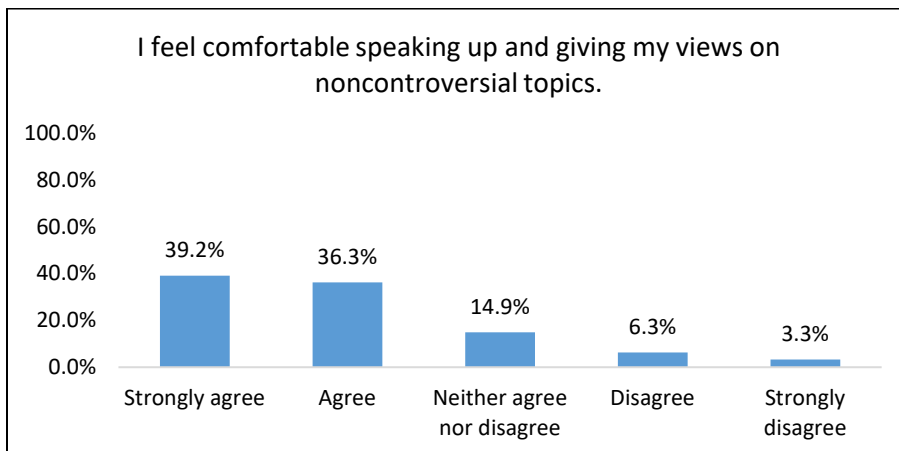


Figure 3.8. Question 8 Student Responses (n = 6,554)

Figure 3.8 shows student responses (n = 6,554) to the question, “I feel comfortable speaking up and giving my views on noncontroversial topics.” Around 75 percent of students agreed that they feel comfortable giving their views on controversial topics. About 10 percent of students disagreed that they feel comfortable speaking up on noncontroversial topics. Fifteen (15) percent of students neither agreed nor disagreed.

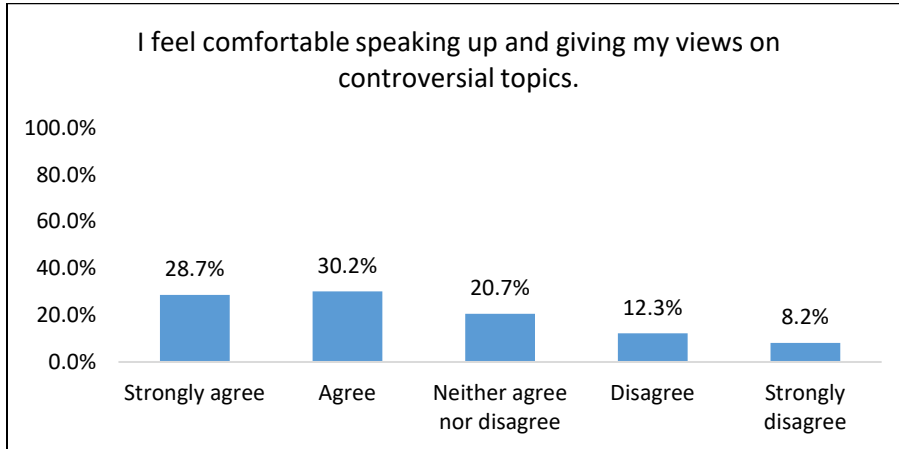


Figure 3.9. Question 9 Student Responses (n = 6,560)

Figure 3.9 shows student responses (n = 6,560) to the question, “I feel comfortable speaking up and giving my views on controversial topics.” Fifty-nine (59) percent of students agreed they feel comfortable speaking up and giving views on controversial topics. Around 20 percent of students disagreed that they feel comfortable speaking up on controversial topics, while about 21 percent of students neither agreed nor disagreed.

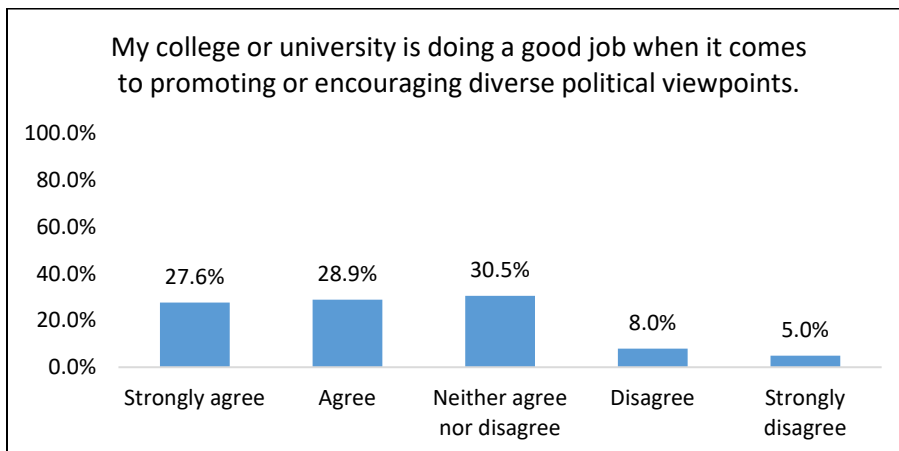


Figure 3.10. Question 10 Student Responses (n = 6,541)

Figure 3.10 shows student responses (n = 6,541) to the question, “My college or university is doing a good job when it comes to promoting or encouraging diverse political viewpoints.” About 56 percent of respondents believe their college or university is doing a good job promoting or encouraging diverse political viewpoints. Thirteen (13) percent of students disagreed that their college is doing a good job promoting diverse political viewpoints. Around 31 percent of students neither agreed nor disagreed.

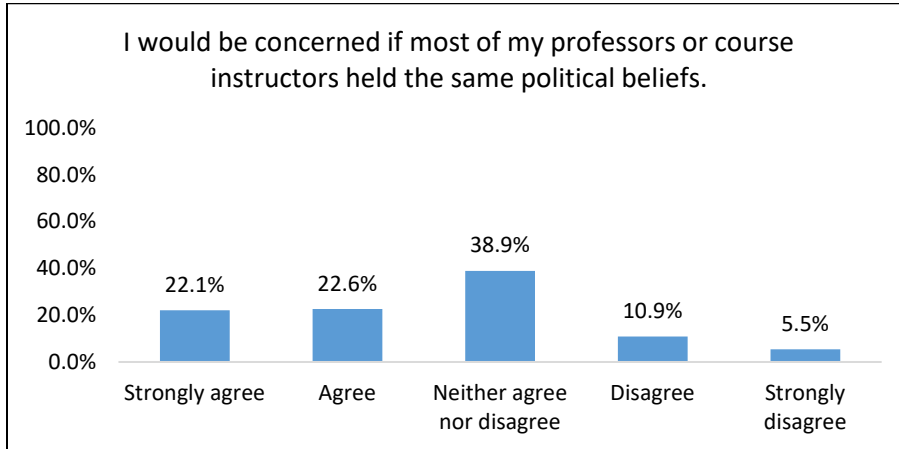


Figure 3.11. Question 11 Student Responses (n = 6,544)

Figure 3.11 shows student responses (n = 6,544) to the question, “I would be concerned if most of my professors or course instructors held the same political beliefs.” About 45 percent of students indicated they would be concerned if most of their professors or course instructors held the same political beliefs. Around 16 percent of students disagreed that they would be concerned if most of their course instructors held the same political beliefs. Almost 39 percent of students neither agreed nor disagreed.

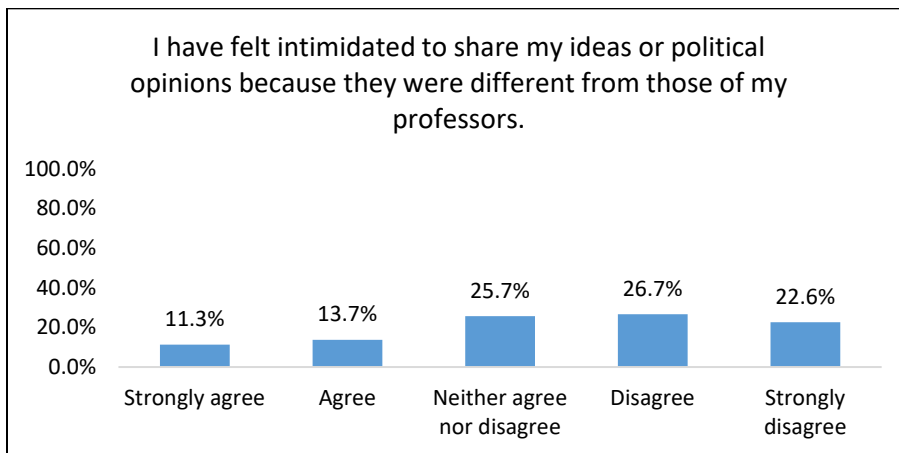


Figure 3.12. Question 12 Student Responses (n = 6,545)

Figure 3.12 shows student responses (n = 6,545) to the question, “I have felt intimidated to share my ideas or political opinions because they were different from those of my professors.” Twenty-five (25) percent of students agreed that they have felt intimidated to share their ideas or political beliefs because they were different than those of their professors. About 49 percent of students disagreed that they have felt intimidated to share their political opinions because they differ from their professors. Around 26 percent of students neither agreed nor disagreed.

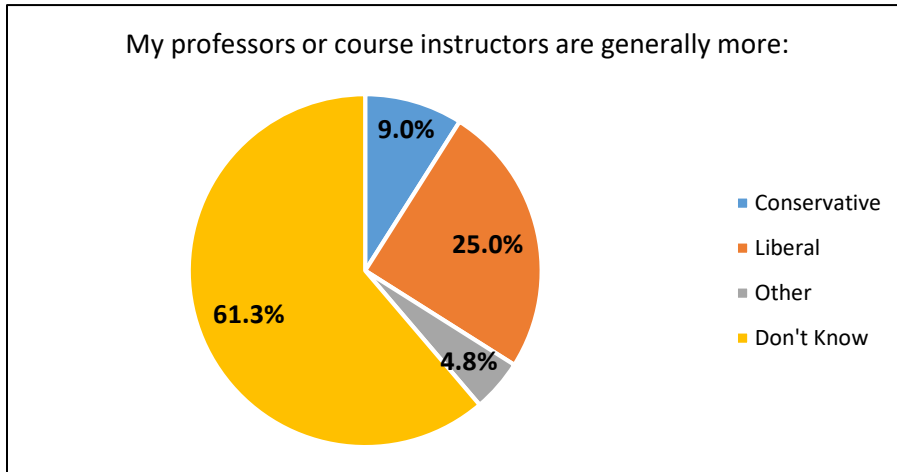


Figure 3.13. Question 13 Student Responses (n = 6,438)

Figure 3.13 shows student responses (n = 6,438) to the question, “My professors or course instructors are generally more: conservative, liberal, other, don’t know.” Around 61 percent of students responded that they did not know the political beliefs of their course instructors. Twenty-five (25) percent of students indicated they believed their course instructors to generally be more liberal, while 9 percent of students believed their instructors to be more conservative. About 5 percent of students responded with “other”.

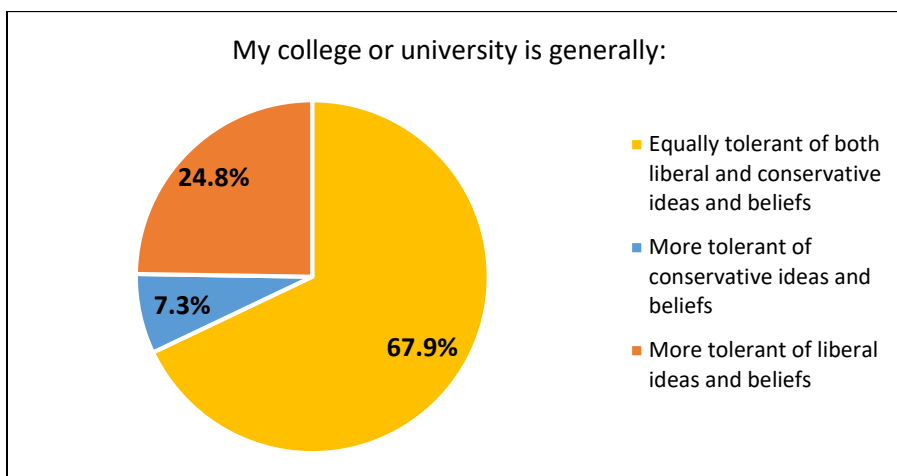


Figure 3.14. Question 14 Student Responses (n = 6,278)

Figure 3.14 shows student responses (n = 6,278) to the question, “My college or university is generally: equally tolerant of both liberal and conservative ideas and beliefs, more tolerant of conservative ideas and beliefs, or more tolerant of liberal ideas and beliefs.” Almost 68 percent of FCS students believe their college is equally tolerant of both liberal and conservative ideas and beliefs. About 25 percent of students indicated their college is more tolerant of liberal ideas and beliefs, and close to 7 percent of students said their college is more tolerant of conservative ideas and beliefs.

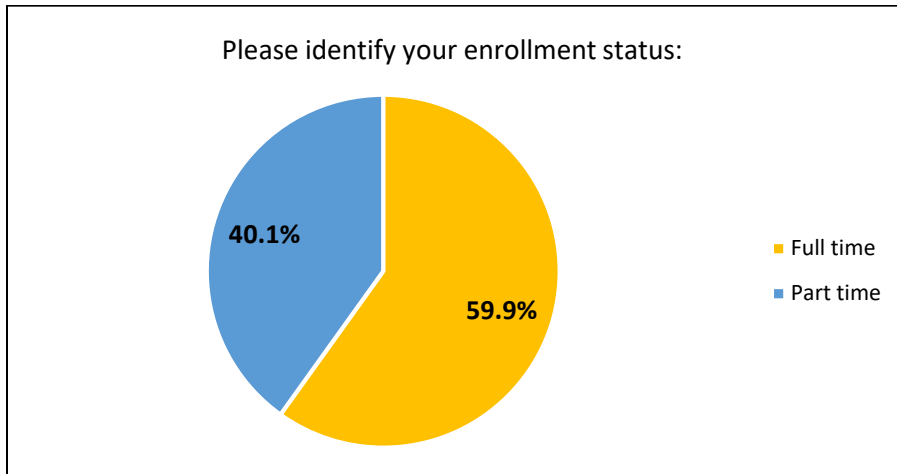


Figure 3.15. Question 15 Student Responses (n = 6,342)

Figure 3.15 shows student responses (n = 6,342) to the question, “Please identify your enrollment status.” Almost 60 percent of respondents are enrolled full time, while about 40 percent are enrolled part time.

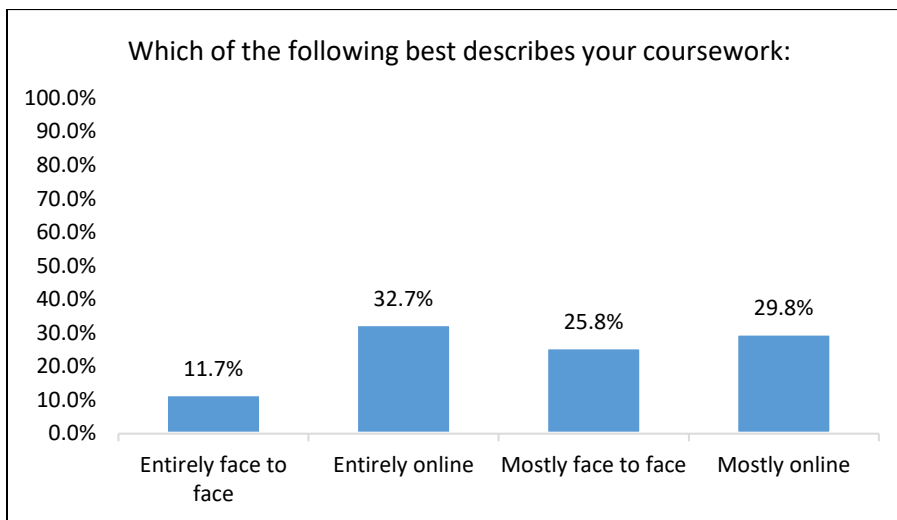


Figure 3.16. Question 16 Student Responses (n = 6,349)

Figure 3.16 shows student responses (n = 6,349) to the question, “Which of the following best describes your coursework.” About 33 percent of students have coursework entirely online, and almost 30 percent have their coursework mostly online. About 26 percent of students indicated their coursework is mostly face to face, while just under 12 percent said their coursework is entirely face to face.

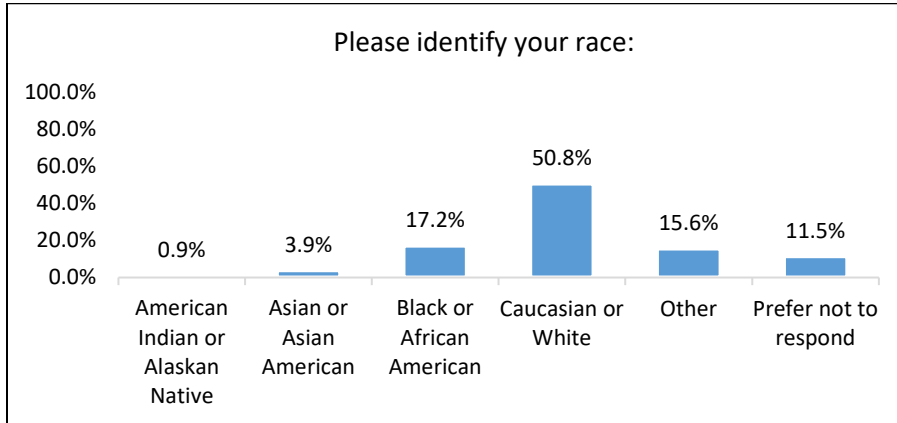


Figure 3.17. Question 17 Student Responses (n = 6,334)

Figure 3.17 shows student responses (n = 6,334) to the question, “Please identify your race.” Almost 51 percent of respondents answered that they were Caucasian or White, and about 17 percent indicated they were Black or African American. About 4 percent of respondents were Asian or Asian American, and about 16 percent of students indicated their race as “other,” with 1 percent indicating American Indian or Alaskan Native. About 11 percent of respondents preferred not to indicate their race.

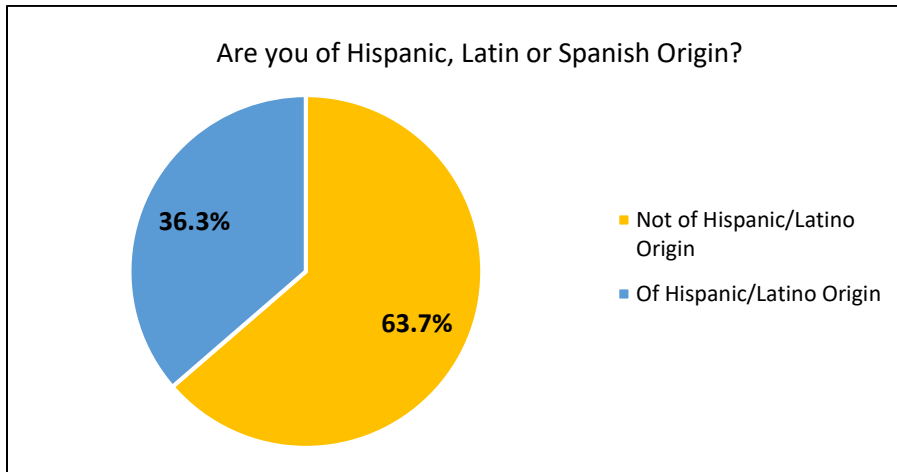


Figure 3.18. Question 18 Student Responses (n = 6,276)

Figure 3.18 shows student responses (n = 6,276) to the question, “Are you of Hispanic, Latin or Spanish Origin?” Almost 64 percent of respondents indicated they were not of Hispanic/Latino Origin, while about 36 percent of respondents were of Hispanic/Latino Origin.

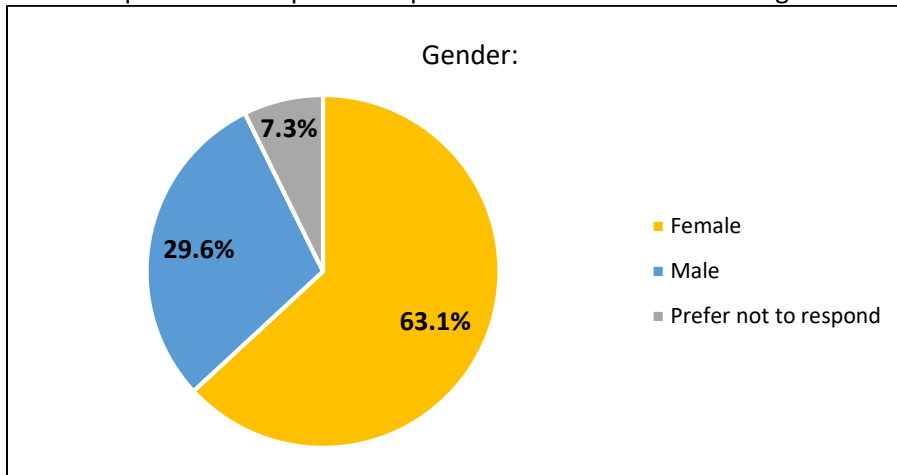


Figure 3.19. Question 19 Student Responses (n = 6,351)

Figure 3.19 shows student responses (n = 6,351) to the question asking students to indicate their gender. About 63 percent of students identified as female, while about 30 percent identified as male. Around 7 percent of respondents preferred not to indicate their gender.

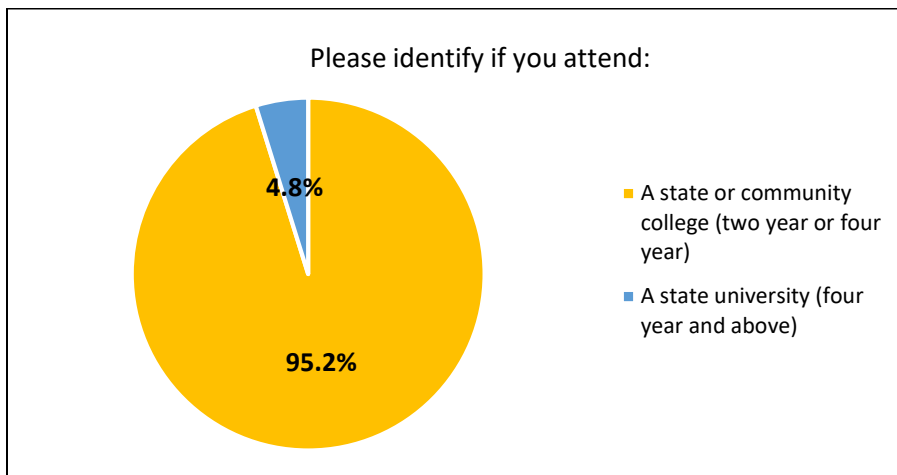


Figure 3.20. Question 20 Student Responses (n = 6,291)

Figure 3.20 shows student responses (n = 6,291) to the question asking to identify which type of institution they attend. About 95 percent of students responded they attend a state or community college, while almost 5 percent of students answered they attend a state university.

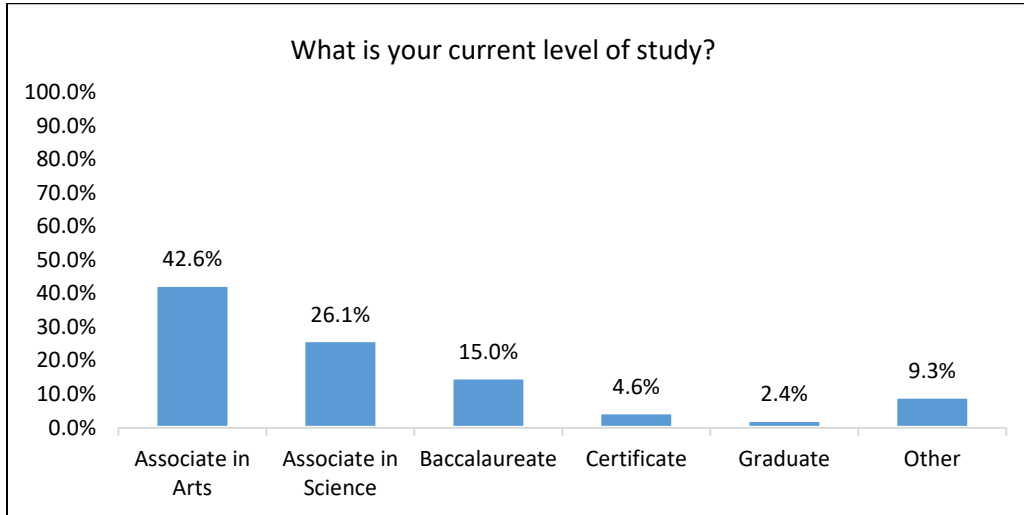


Figure 3.21. Question 21 Student Responses (n = 6,336)

Figure 3.21 shows student responses (n = 6,336) to the question, “What is your current level of study?” Almost 69 percent of students indicated they are in an associate program, and about 15 percent indicated they are in baccalaureate degree programs. Roughly 5 percent of respondents indicated they are in a certificate program while 9 percent selected “other” as their program. Two (2) percent indicated they are graduate students.

Section 4. Instructional Employee Responses

Table 4.1 shows instructional employee response rates by FCS institution. “Instructional employees” include faculty with continuing contracts/tenure and faculty without continuing contracts/tenure. The most frequent method of distribution was via email (n = 27). Of the more than 20,000 instructional employees who received the survey, 2,245 responded, representing a total response rate of 10.8 percent.

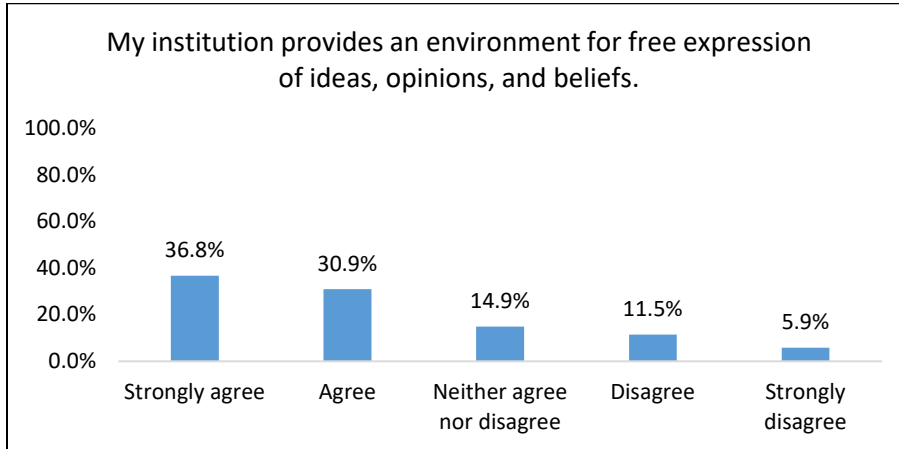


Figure 4.1. Question 1 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 2,236)

Figure 4.1 shows instructional employee responses (n = 2,236) to the question, “My institution provides an environment for free expression of ideas, opinions, and beliefs.” About 68 percent of instructional employees agreed that their institution provides such an environment. Around 17 percent of instructional employees disagreed that their institution provides an environment for free expression of ideas. Almost 15 percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed.

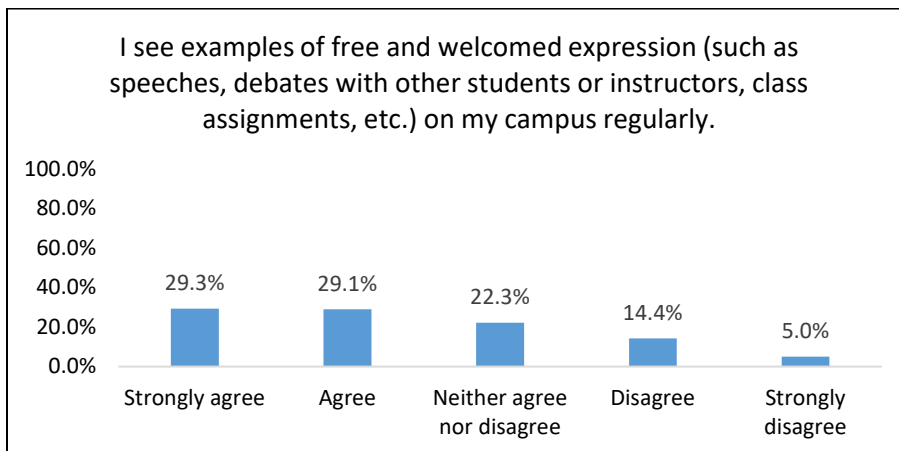


Figure 4.2. Question 2 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 2,229)

Figure 4.2 shows instructional employee responses (n = 2,229) to the question, “I see examples of free and welcomed expression (such as speeches, debates with other students or instructors, class assignments, etc.) on my campus regularly.” About 59 percent of respondents agreed that they see examples of free and welcomed expression on campus. Around 19 percent of instructional employees disagreed. About 22 percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed.

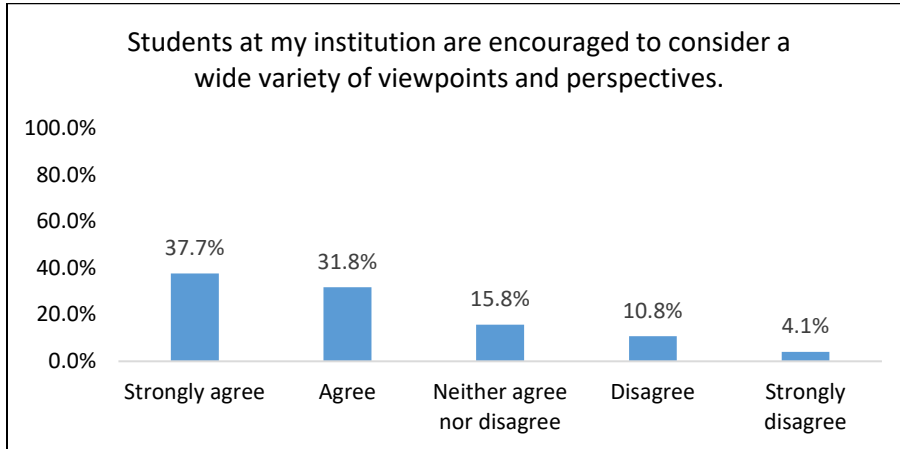


Figure 4.3. Question 3 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 2,220)

Figure 4.3 shows instructional employee responses (n = 2,220) to the question, “Students at my institution are encouraged to consider a wide variety of viewpoints and perspectives.” Around 69 percent of instructional employees agreed that students are encouraged to consider a wide variety of viewpoints and perspectives. About 15 percent of respondents disagreed that students are encouraged to consider a wide variety of viewpoints, while 16 percent neither agreed nor disagreed.

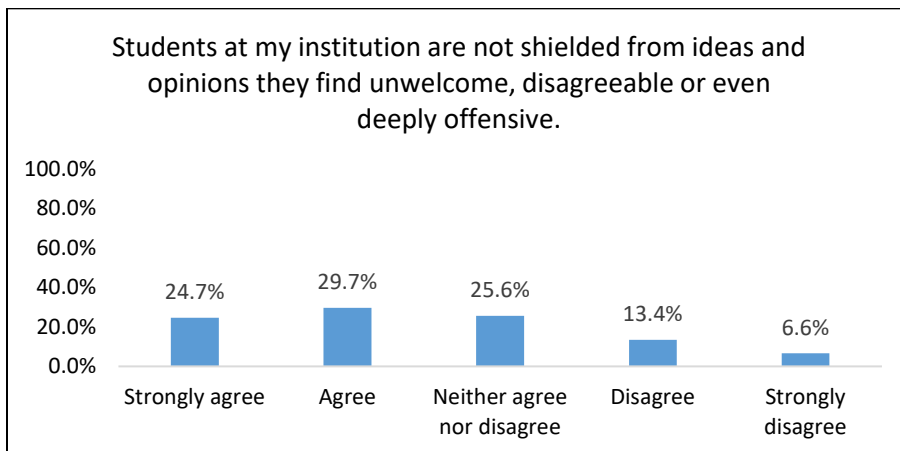


Figure 4.4. Question 4 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 2,202)

Figure 4.4 shows instructional employee responses (n = 2,202) to the question, “Students at my institution are not shielded from ideas and opinions they find unwelcome, disagreeable, or even deeply offensive.” About 54 percent of respondents agreed that students are not shielded from unwelcome opinions. Twenty (20) percent of respondents disagreed that students are not shielded from ideas and opinions they find unwelcome, disagreeable, or deeply offensive. Around 26 percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed.

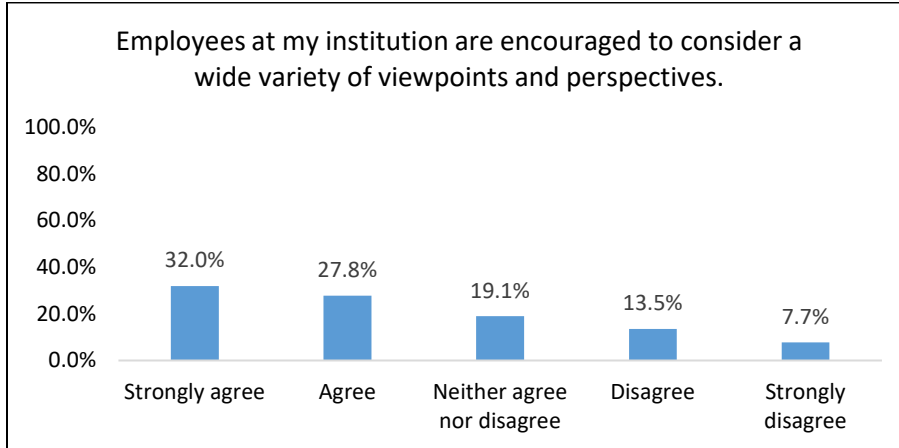


Figure 4.5. Question 5 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 2,219)

Figure 4.5 shows instructional employee responses (n = 2,219) to the question, “Employees at my institution are encouraged to consider a wide variety of viewpoints and perspectives.” About 60 percent of instructional employees agreed that employees are encouraged to consider a wide variety of viewpoints and perspectives. About 21 percent disagreed and 19 percent neither agreed nor disagreed.

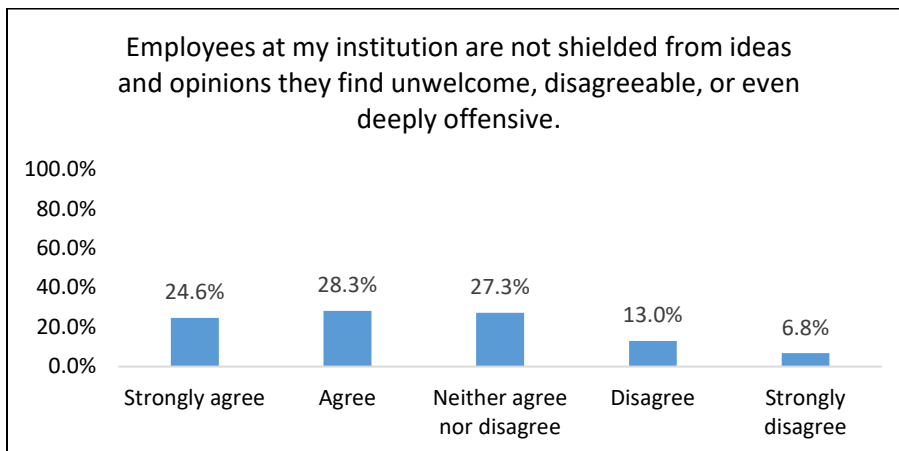


Figure 4.6. Question 6 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 2,196)

Figure 4.6 shows instructional employee responses (n = 2,196) to the question, “Employees at my institution are not shielded from ideas and opinions they find unwelcome, disagreeable, or even deeply offensive.” Almost 53 percent of instructional respondents agreed that employees are not shielded from ideas and opinions they find unwelcome. About 20 percent of respondents disagreed that employees are not shielded from ideas they may find offensive, while about 27 percent neither agreed nor disagreed.

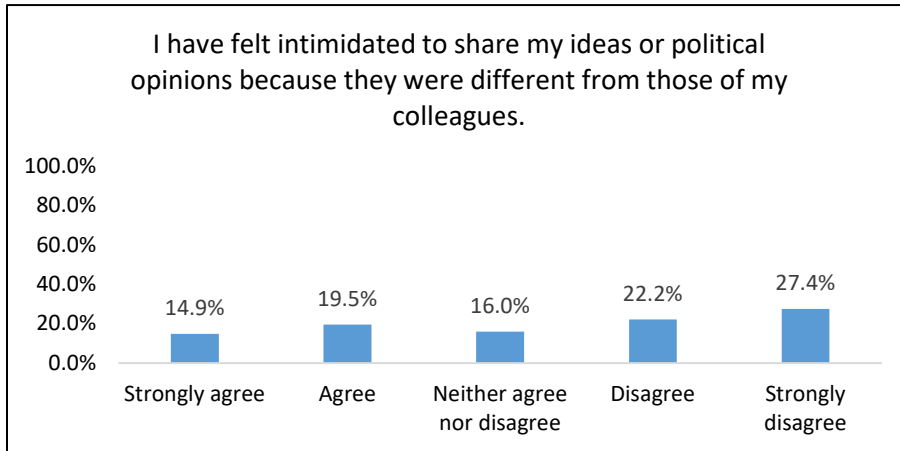


Figure 4.7. Question 7 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 2,222)

Figure 4.7 shows instructional employee responses (n = 2,222) to the question, “I have felt intimidated to share my ideas or political opinions because they were different from those of my colleagues.” About 34 percent of instructional employees agreed they have felt intimidated to share their ideas because they were different from their colleagues. Almost 50 percent of respondents disagreed that they have felt intimidated to share their political opinions. Sixteen (16) percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed.

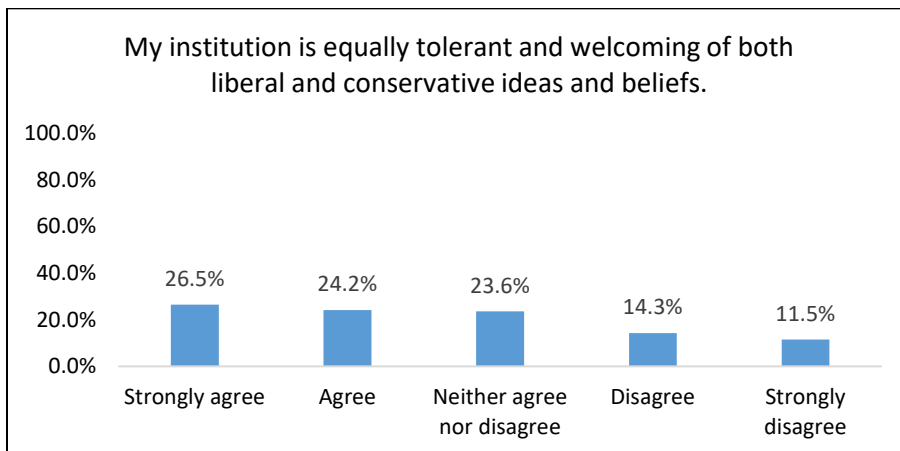


Figure 4.8. Question 8 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 2,225)

Figure 4.8 shows instructional employee responses (n = 2,225) to the question, “My institution is equally tolerant and welcoming of both liberal and conservative ideas and beliefs.” Almost 51 percent of respondents agreed their institution is equally tolerant and welcoming of both liberal and conservative beliefs. Almost 26 percent of respondents disagreed that their institution is equally welcoming, while about 23 percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed.

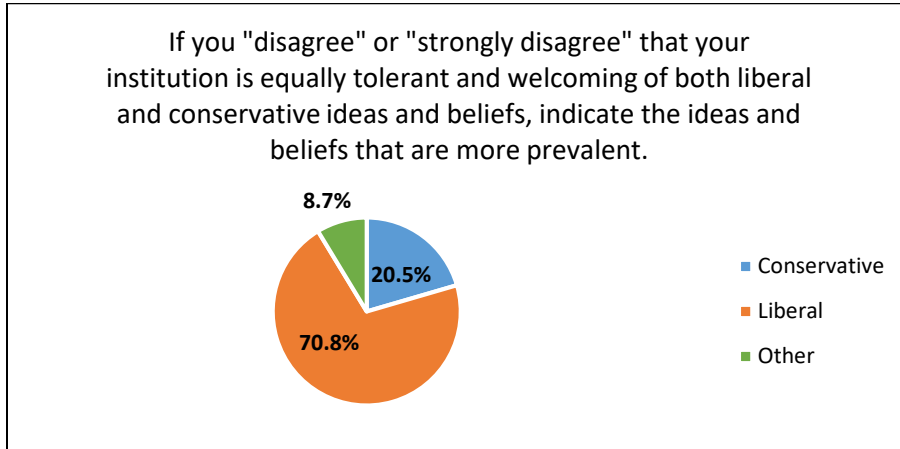


Figure 4.9. Question 9 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 576)

Figure 4.9 shows instructional employee responses (n = 576) to the question, “If you ‘disagree’ or ‘strongly disagree’ that your institution is equally tolerant and welcoming of both liberal and conservative ideas and beliefs, indicate the ideas and beliefs that are more prevalent.” Almost 71 percent of respondents indicated they believed liberal beliefs to be more prevalent. About 20 percent indicated conservative beliefs, while about 9 percent responded with “other.”

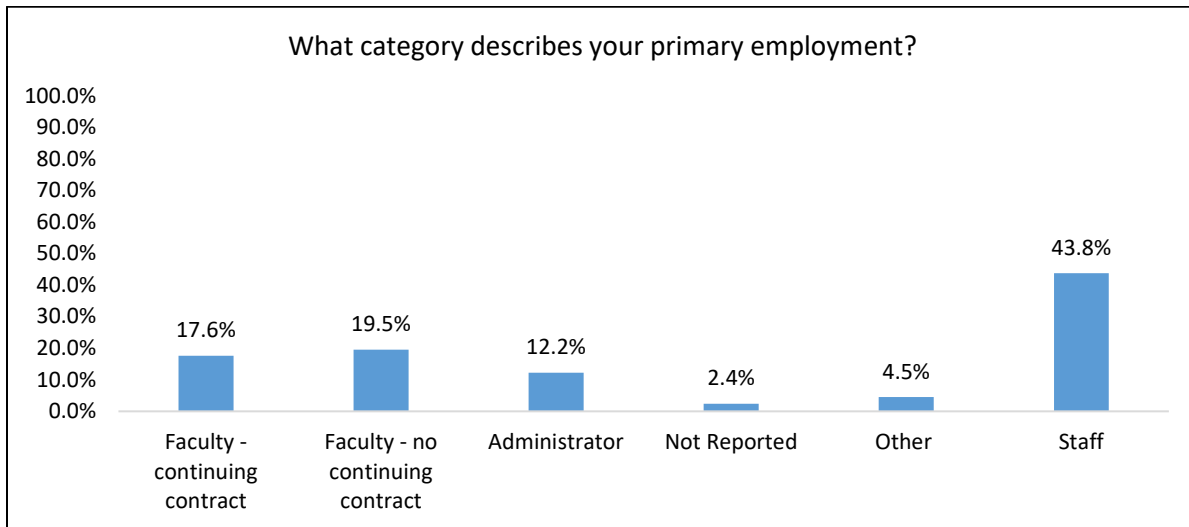


Figure 4.10. Question 10 Employee Responses (n = 6,051)

Figure 4.10 shows employee responses (n = 6,051) to the question, “What category describes your primary employment with your institution?” Nearly 18 percent of respondents identified as faculty with continuing contract/tenure and nearly 20 percent of respondents identified as faculty without continuing contract/tenure.

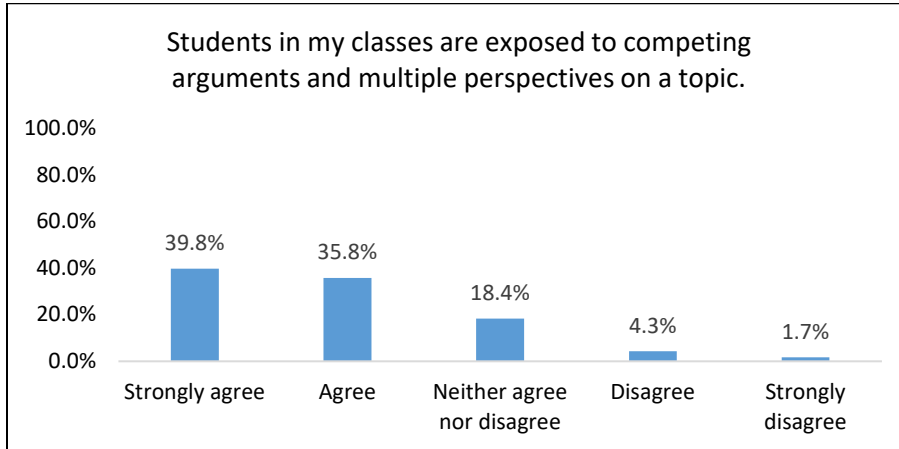


Figure 4.11. Question 11 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 2,165)

Figure 4.11 shows instructional employee responses (n = 2,165) to the question, “Students in my class are exposed to competing arguments and multiple perspectives on a topic.” Almost 76 percent of instructional employees agreed that students in their classes are exposed to multiple perspectives on topics. Six (6) percent of respondents disagreed that students are exposed to competing arguments in class. About 18 percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed.

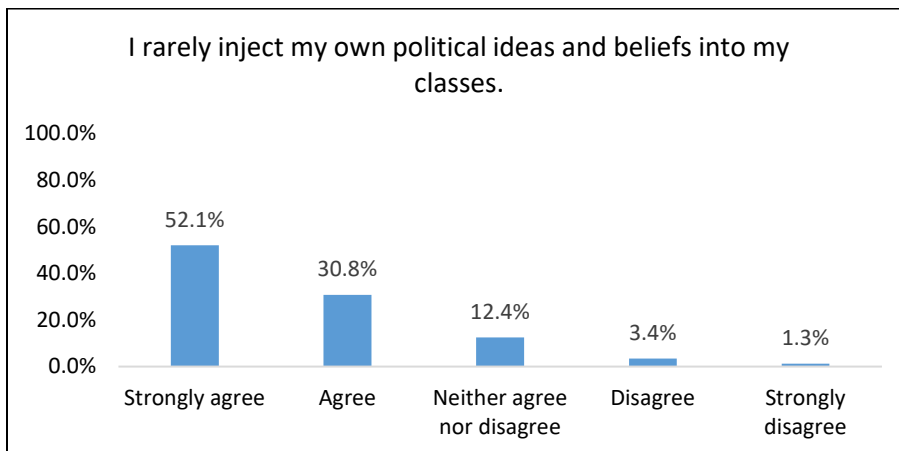


Figure 4.12. Question 12 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 2,178)

Figure 4.12 shows instructional employee responses (n = 2,178) to the question, “I rarely inject my own political ideas and beliefs into my classes.” Almost 83 percent of instructional employees agreed they rarely inject their own political ideas into their classes. About 5 percent of instructional employees disagreed that they rarely inject their own political beliefs into their classes. Around 12 percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed.

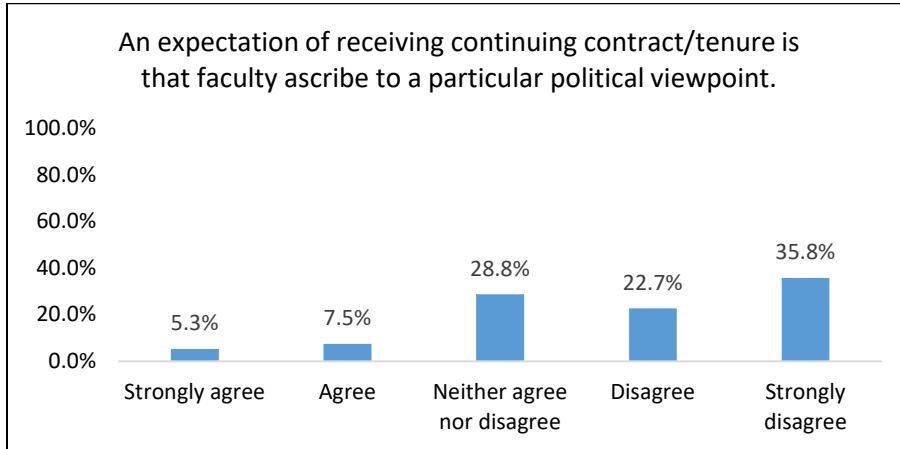


Figure 4.13. Question 13 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 2,168)

Figure 4.13 shows instructional employee responses (n = 2,168) to the question, “An expectation of receiving continuing contract/tenure is that faculty ascribe to a particular political viewpoint.” Almost 13 percent of instructional employee respondents agreed. About 58 percent of respondents disagreed that an expectation of continuing contract is ascribing to a particular political viewpoint. Almost 29 percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed.

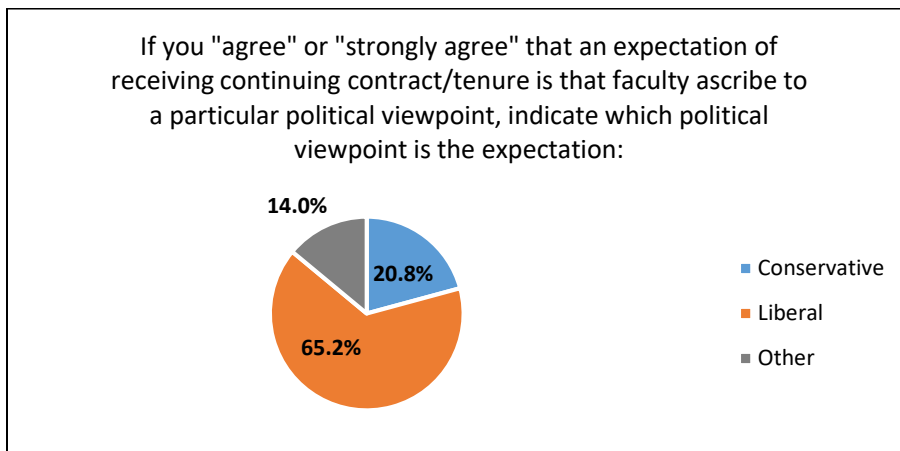


Figure 4.14. Question 14 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 279)

Figure 4.14 shows instructional employee responses (n = 279) to the question, “If you ‘agree’ or ‘strongly agree’ that an expectation of receiving continuing contract/tenure is that faculty ascribe to a particular political viewpoint, indicate which political viewpoint is the expectation.” About 65 percent of respondents indicated they believed liberal viewpoints are the expectation. Almost 21 percent of respondents indicated conservative viewpoints, and 14 percent responded with “other.”

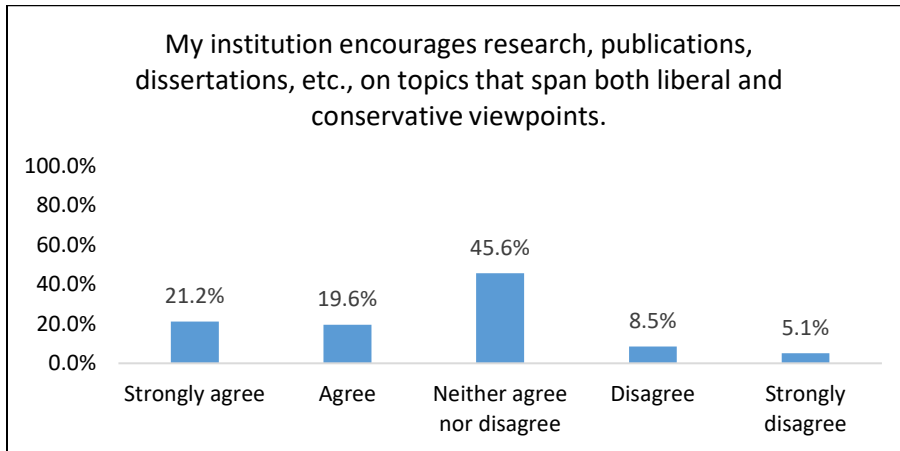


Figure 4.15. Question 15 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 2,145)

Figure 4.15 shows instructional employee responses (n = 2,145) to the question, “My institution encourages research, publications, dissertations, etc., on topics that span both liberal and conservative viewpoints.” Almost 41 percent of respondents agreed that their institutions encourage research that spans both liberal and conservative viewpoints. About 45 percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed, while about 14 percent of respondents disagreed.

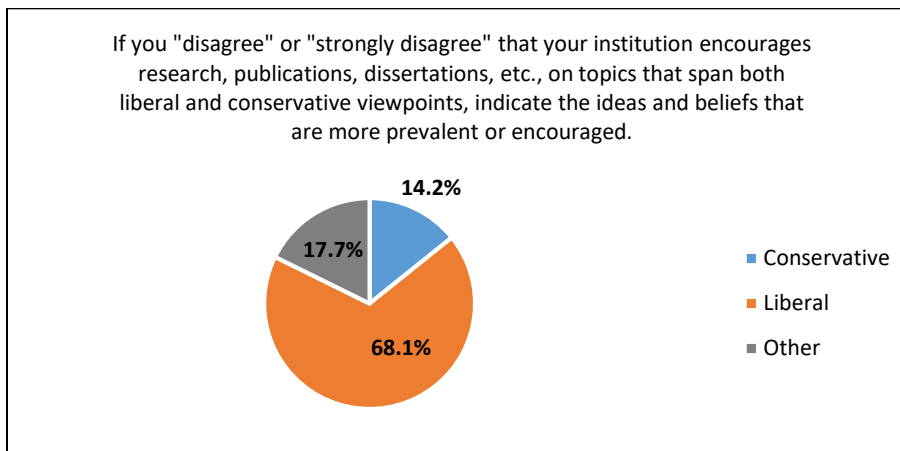


Figure 4.16. Question 16 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 288)

Figure 4.16 shows instructional employee responses (n = 288) to the question, “If you ‘disagree’ or ‘strongly disagree’ that your institution encourages research, publications, dissertations, etc. on topics that span both liberal and conservative viewpoints, indicate the ideas and beliefs that are more prevalent or encouraged.” About 68 percent of respondents indicated they believed liberal beliefs are encouraged. Around 14 percent indicated conservative beliefs, while almost 18 percent of respondents indicated “other.”

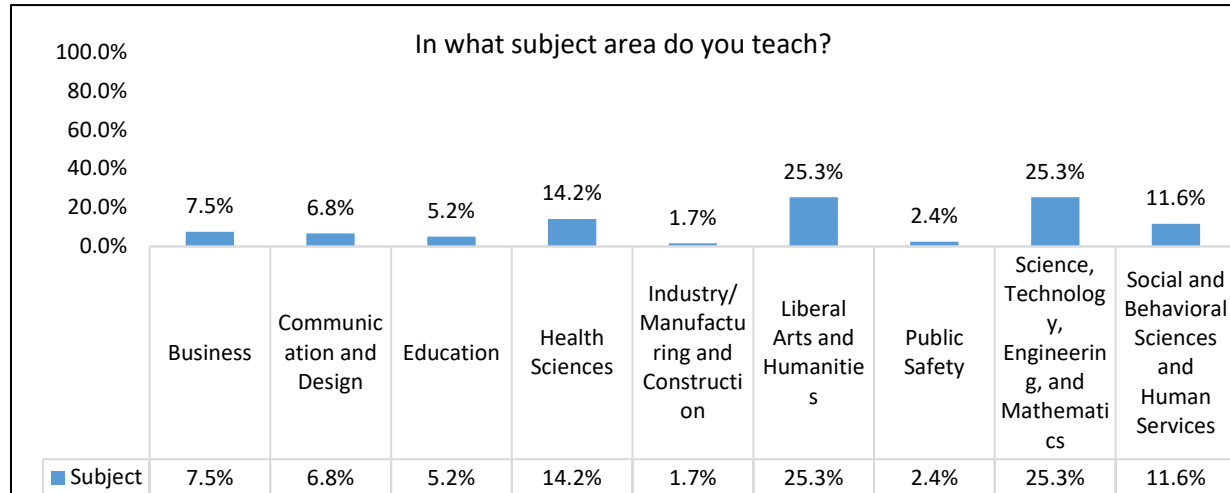


Figure 4.17. Question 17 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 2,111)

Figure 4.17 shows instructional employee responses (n = 2,111) to the question, “In what subject area do you teach?” About 25 percent of respondents indicated they teach in the Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) field, with another 25 percent indicating they teach in liberal arts and humanities. About 14 percent were in health sciences, 12 percent in social and behavioral sciences, and human services, and 8 percent in business. The remaining respondents taught in other subject areas.

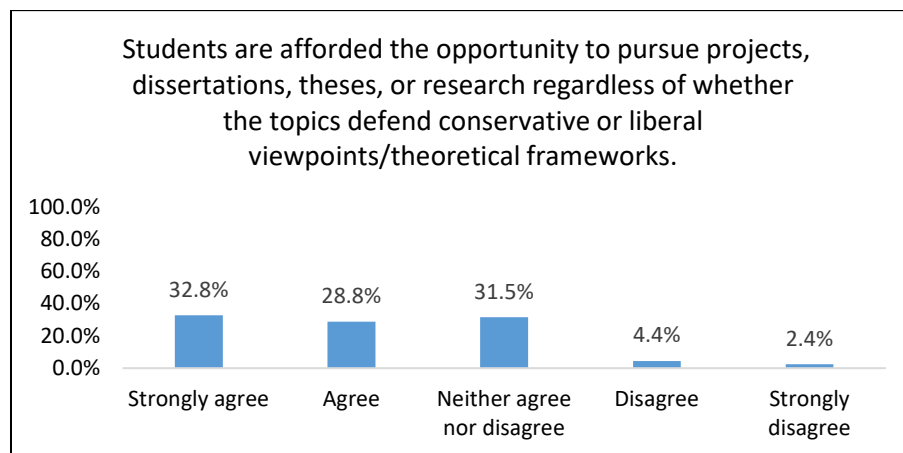


Figure 4.18. Question 18 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 2,133)

Figure 4.18 shows instructional employee responses (n = 2,133) to the question, “Students are afforded the opportunity to pursue projects, dissertations, theses, or research regardless of whether the topics defend conservative or liberal viewpoints/theoretical frameworks.” About 61 percent of instructional employees responded they agreed that students are afforded the opportunity to pursue projects regardless of whether the topics defend conservative or liberal viewpoints. Almost 7 percent of respondents disagreed, while about 32 percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed.

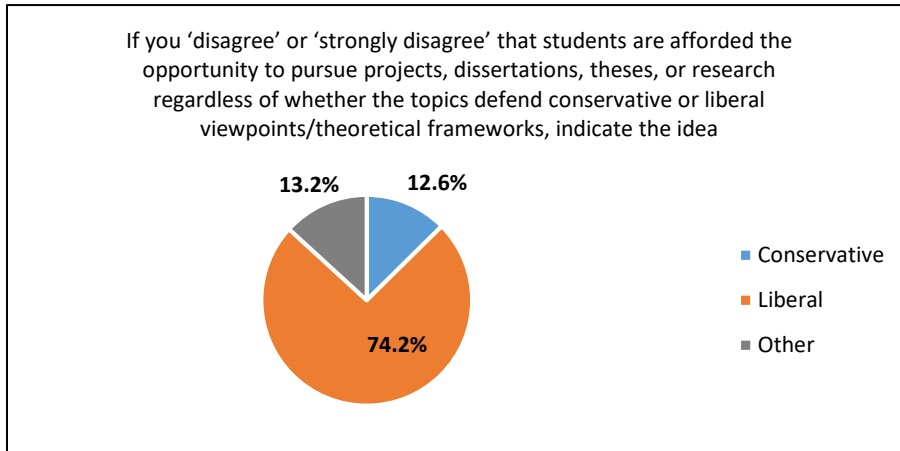


Figure 4.19. Question 19 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 151)

Figure 4.19 shows instructional employee responses (n = 151) to the question, “If you ‘disagree’ or ‘strongly disagree’ that students are afforded the opportunity to pursue projects, dissertations, theses, or research regardless of whether the topics defend conservative or liberal viewpoints/theoretical frameworks, indicate the ideas and beliefs that are more prevalent or encouraged.” The majority of respondents (74 percent) indicated liberal viewpoints/theoretical frameworks are more prevalent or encouraged.

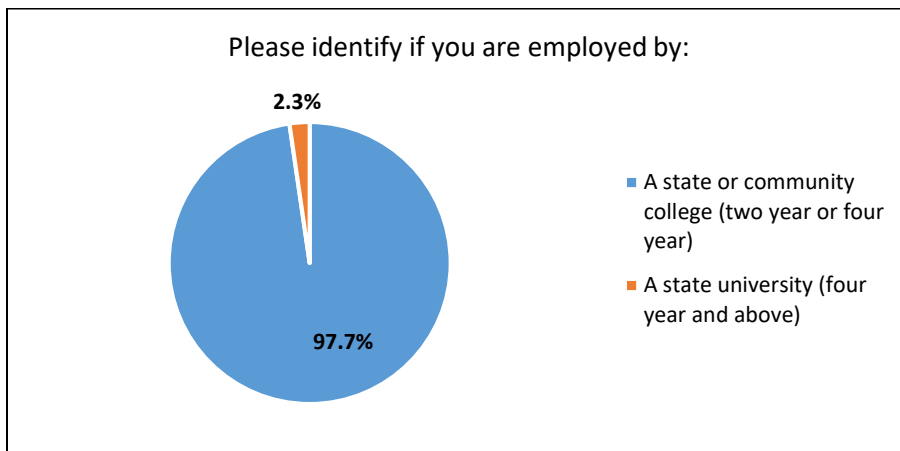


Figure 4.20. Question 20 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 2,132)

Figure 4.20 shows instructional employee responses (n = 2,132) to the question, “Please identify if you are employed by: a state or community college (two year or four year) or a state university (four year and above).” Nearly 98 percent of responses indicated they are employed by a state or community college.

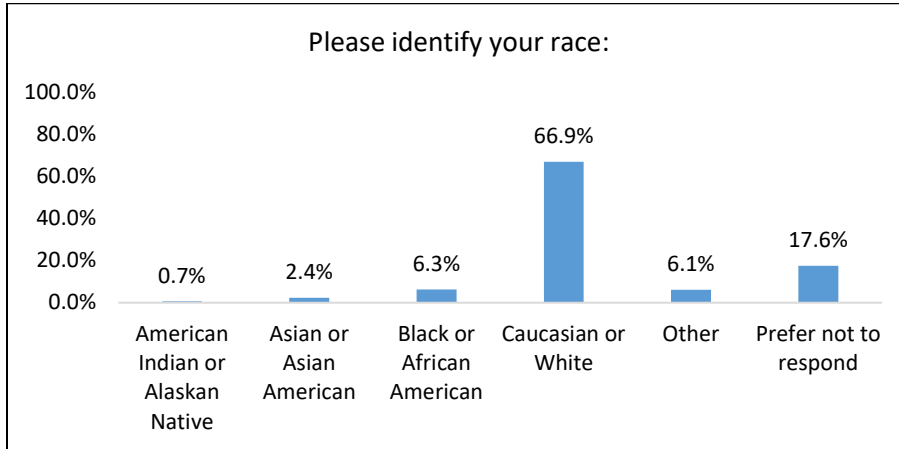


Figure 4.21. Question 21 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 2,114)

Figure 4.21 shows instructional employee responses (n = 2,114) to the question, “Please identify your race.” Almost 67 percent of respondents indicated they were Caucasian or White. About 18 percent indicated they preferred not to respond. About 6 percent indicated they were Black or African American and another 6 percent indicated “other.” Around 2 percent indicated Asian or Asian American, while about 1 percent indicated American Indian or Alaskan Native.

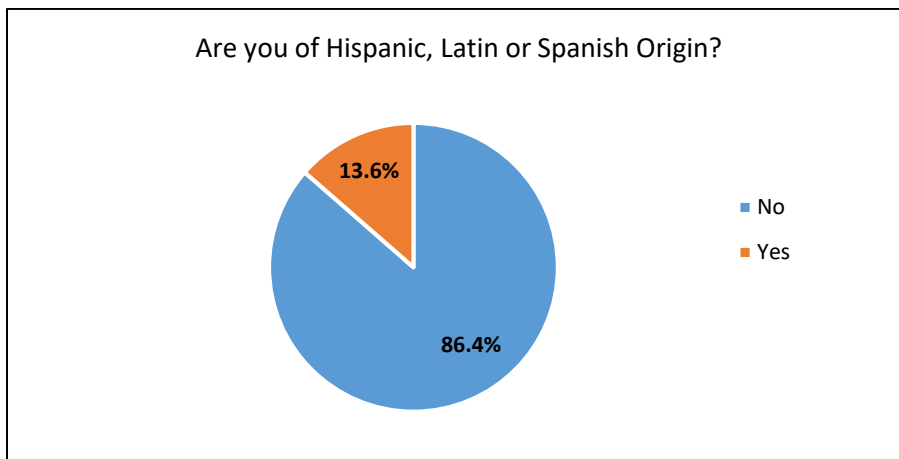


Figure 4.22. Question 22 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 2,004)

Figure 4.22 shows instructional employee responses (n = 2,004) to the question, “Are you of Hispanic, Latin or Spanish Origin?” About 86 percent of respondents indicated they were not of Hispanic origin, while about 14 percent of respondents indicated they were of Hispanic, Latin, or Spanish origin.

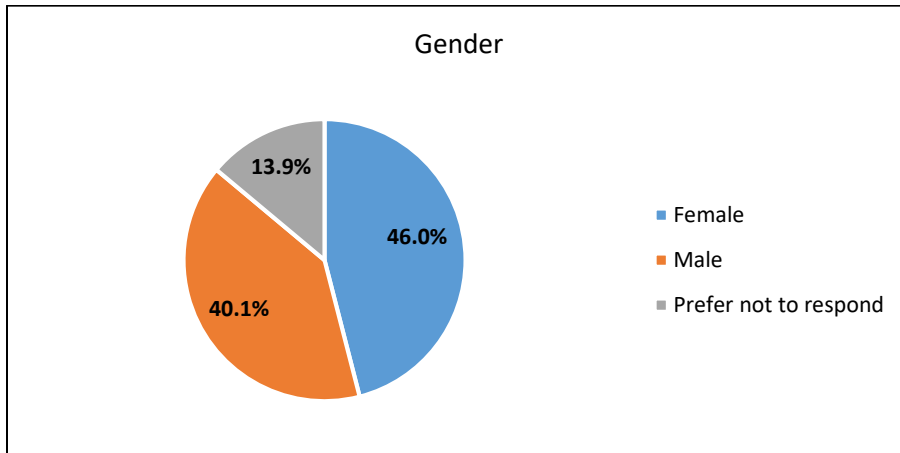


Figure 4.23. Question 23 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 2,120)

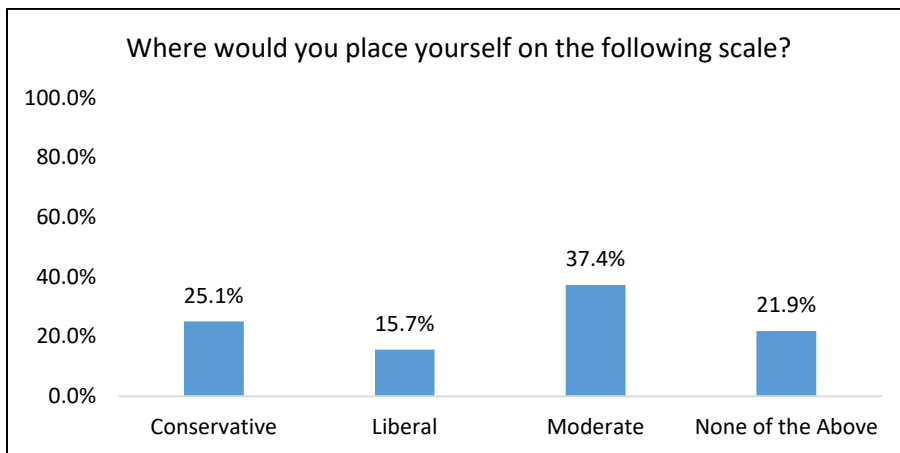


Figure 4.24. Question 24 Instructional Employee Responses (n = 2,063)

Section 5. Non-Instructional Employee Responses

Table 5.1 shows non-instructional employee response rates by FCS institution. “Non-instructional employees” include administrators, staff, other employees, or employees who did not report their primary area of employment. The most frequent method of distribution was via email (n = 27). Of the more than 23,000 non-instructional employees who received the survey, 3,802 responded, representing a total response rate of 16.3 percent.

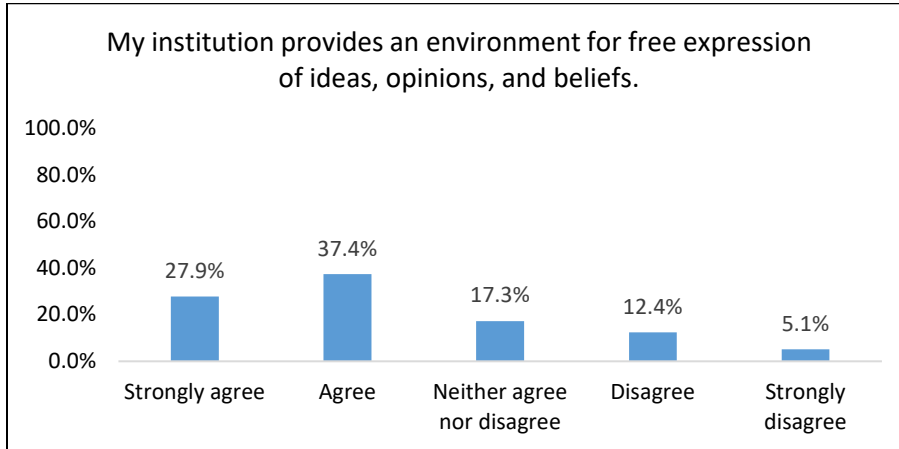


Figure 5.1. Question 1 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 3,766)

Figure 5.1 shows non-instructional employee responses (n = 3,766) to the question, “My institution provides an environment for free expression of ideas, opinions, and beliefs.” About 65 percent of respondents agreed that their institution provides such an environment. Around 18 percent of respondents disagreed that their institution provides an environment for free expression of ideas, opinions, and beliefs. About 17 percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed.

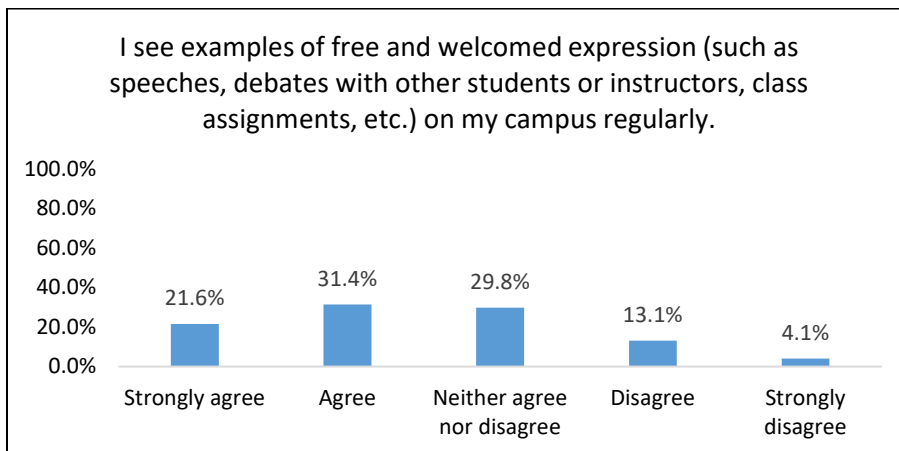


Figure 5.2. Question 2 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 3,717)

Figure 5.2 shows non-instructional employee responses (n = 3,717) to the question, “I see examples of free and welcomed expression (such as speeches, debates with other students or instructors, class assignments, etc.) on my campus regularly.” Fifty-three (53) percent of non-instructional respondents agreed that they see examples of free and welcomed expression on their campuses. About 17 percent of respondents disagreed, while almost 30 percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed.

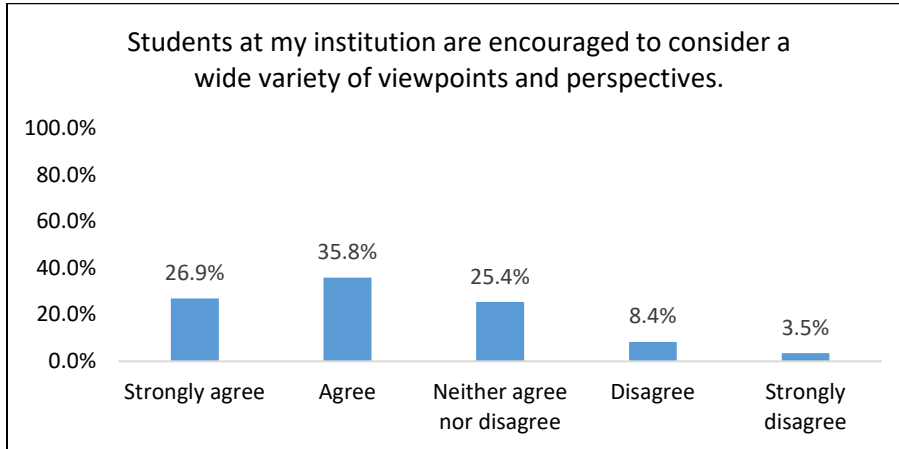


Figure 5.3. Question 3 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 3,696)

Figure 5.3 shows non-instructional employee responses (n = 3,696) to the question, “Students at my institution are encouraged to consider a wide variety of viewpoints and perspectives.” Almost 63 percent of respondents agreed that students are encouraged to consider a wide variety of viewpoints. Almost 12 percent of respondents disagreed. Around 25 percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed.

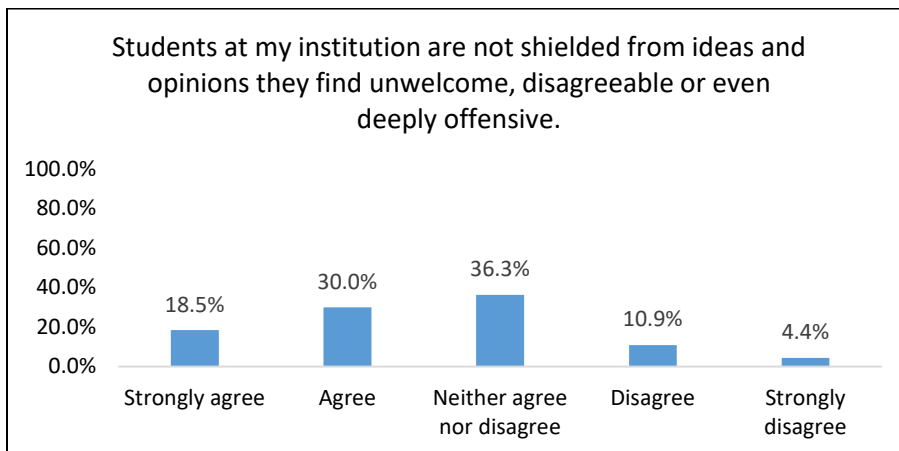


Figure 5.4. Question 4 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 3,652)

Figure 5.4 shows non-instructional employee responses (n = 3,652) to the question, “Students at my institution are not shielded from ideas and opinions they find unwelcome, disagreeable or even deeply offensive.” Almost 49 percent of respondents agreed that students at their institution are not shielded from ideas they might find unwelcome or offensive. About 15 percent of non-instructional employee respondents indicated they disagreed. About 36 percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed.

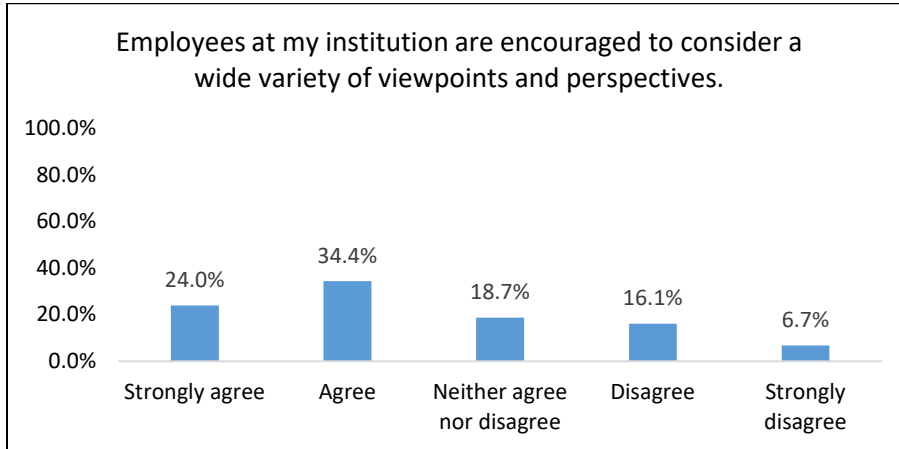


Figure 5.5. Question 5 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 3,736)

Figure 5.5 shows non-instructional employee responses (n = 3,736) to the question, “Employees at my institution are encouraged to consider a wide variety of viewpoints and perspectives.” About 58 percent of respondents agreed that employees are encouraged to consider a wide variety of viewpoints. Nearly 23 percent of respondents disagreed that employees are encouraged to consider a wide variety of perspectives. Almost 19 percent neither agreed nor disagreed.

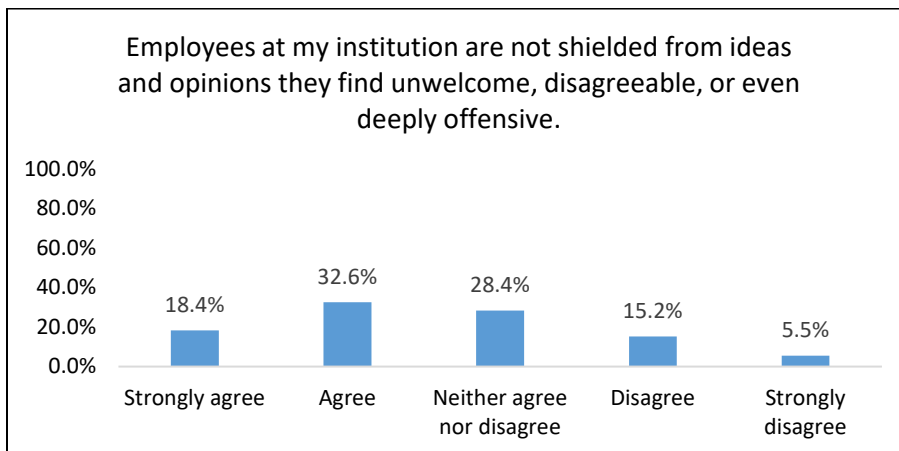


Figure 5.6. Question 6 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 3,689)

Figure 5.6 shows non-instructional employee responses (n = 3,689) to the question, “Employees at my institution are not shielded from ideas and opinions they find unwelcome, disagreeable, or even deeply offensive.” Fifty-one (51) percent of non-instructional respondents agreed that employees are not shielded from ideas they find unwelcome. Almost 21 percent of respondents disagreed, while about 28 percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed.

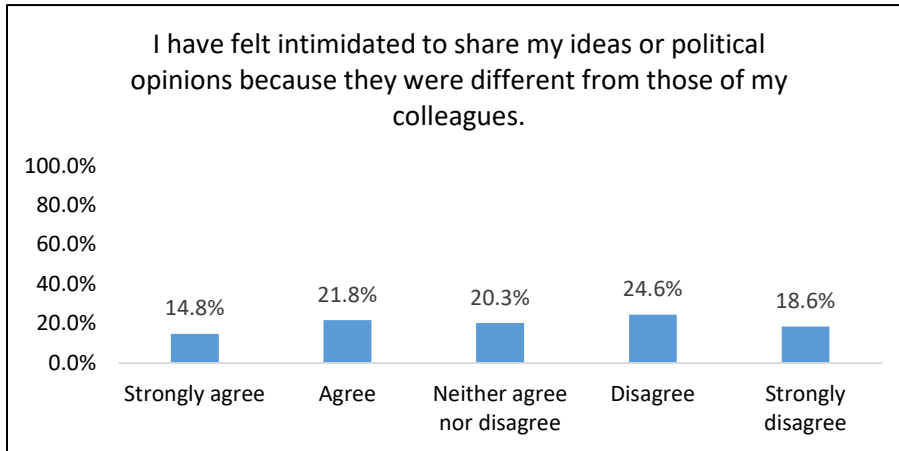


Figure 5.7. Question 7 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 3,749)

Figure 5.7 shows non-instructional employee responses (n = 3,749) to the question, “I have felt intimidated to share my ideas or political opinions because they were different from those of my colleagues.” About 37 percent of respondents agreed that they have felt intimidated to share ideas because they were different from their colleagues. About 42 percent of non-instructional respondents disagreed that they have felt intimidated to share political beliefs with colleagues. Around 20 percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed.

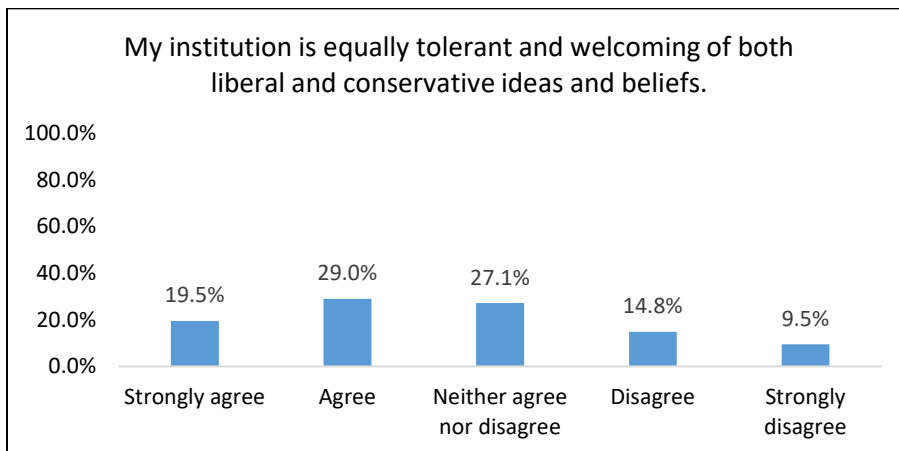


Figure 5.8. Question 8 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 3,745)

Figure 5.8 shows non-instructional employee responses (n = 3,745) to the question, “My institution is equally tolerant and welcoming of both liberal and conservative ideas and beliefs.” About 49 percent of non-instructional respondents agreed that their institution is equally tolerant and welcoming of both liberal and conservative ideas and beliefs. Around 24 percent of non-instructional respondents disagreed, while about 27 percent neither agreed nor disagreed.

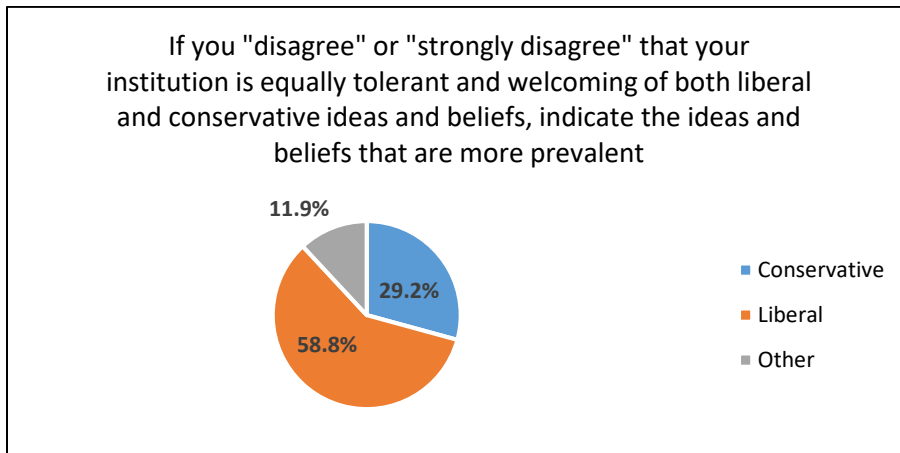


Figure 5.9. Question 9 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 889)

Figure 5.9 shows non-instructional employee responses (n = 889) to the question, “If you ‘disagree’ or ‘strongly disagree’ that your institution is equally tolerant and welcoming of both liberal and conservative ideas and beliefs, indicate the ideas and beliefs that are more prevalent.” Of the respondents who disagreed or strongly disagreed, about 60 percent of non-instructional employees indicated that liberal beliefs were more prevalent. About 29 percent of respondents indicated conservative beliefs were more prevalent, while almost 12 percent indicated other beliefs were more prevalent.

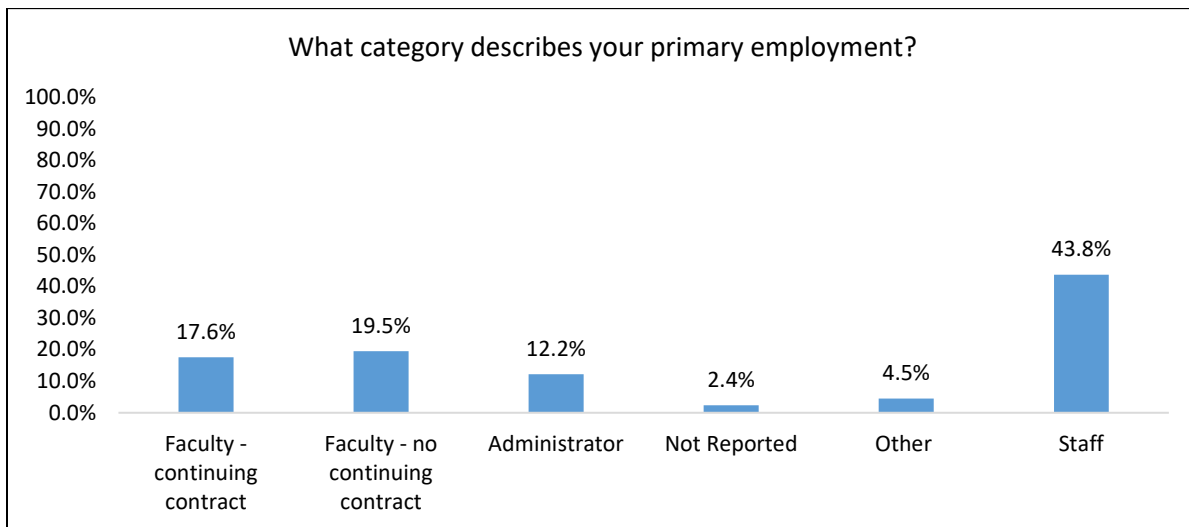


Figure 5.10. Question 10 Employee Responses (n = 6,051)

Figure 5.10 shows employee responses (n = 6,051) to the question, “What category describes your primary employment with your institution?” Twelve (12) percent of respondents indicated they are administrators and almost 44 percent indicated they are staff. “Other” accounted for nearly 5 percent of respondents. About 2 percent did not report an employee category. For purposes of summarizing results, these respondents are reflected as non-instructional personnel.

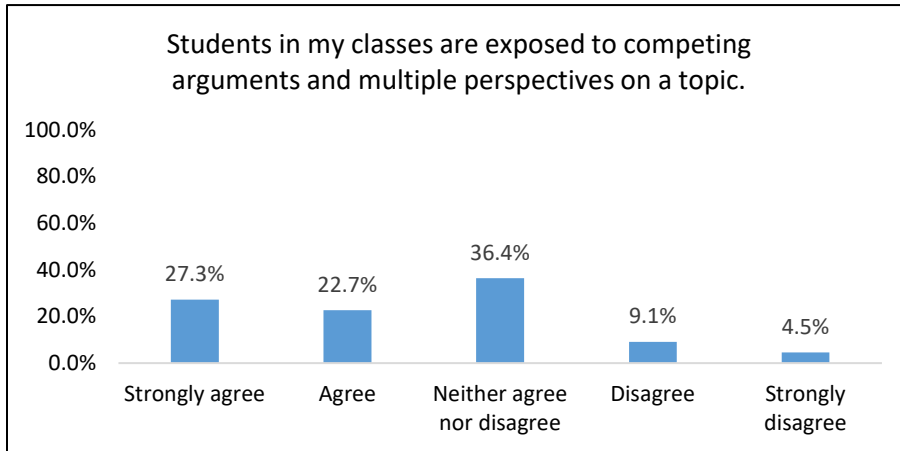


Figure 5.11. Question 11 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 44)

Figure 5.11 shows non-instructional employee responses (n = 44) to the question, “Students in my class are exposed to competing arguments and multiple perspectives on a topic.” While these respondents did not identify as faculty members as their primary employment, it is feasible that employees who fall into other employment categories serve as adjunct instructors. Therefore, the results are reported. Fifty (50) percent of the respondents agreed that students are exposed to competing arguments and multiple perspectives. Almost 14 percent disagreed, while 36 percent neither agreed nor disagreed.

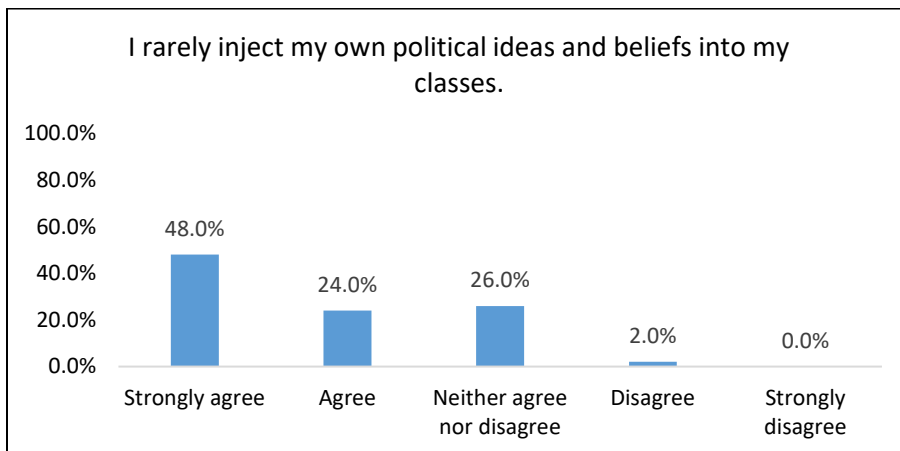


Figure 5.12. Question 12 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 50)

Figure 5.12 shows non-instructional employee responses (n = 50) to the question, “I rarely inject my own political ideas and beliefs into my classes.” The majority (72 percent) of non-instructional employees agreed that they rarely inject their own political beliefs into their classes. Twenty-six percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed, and 2 percent disagreed.

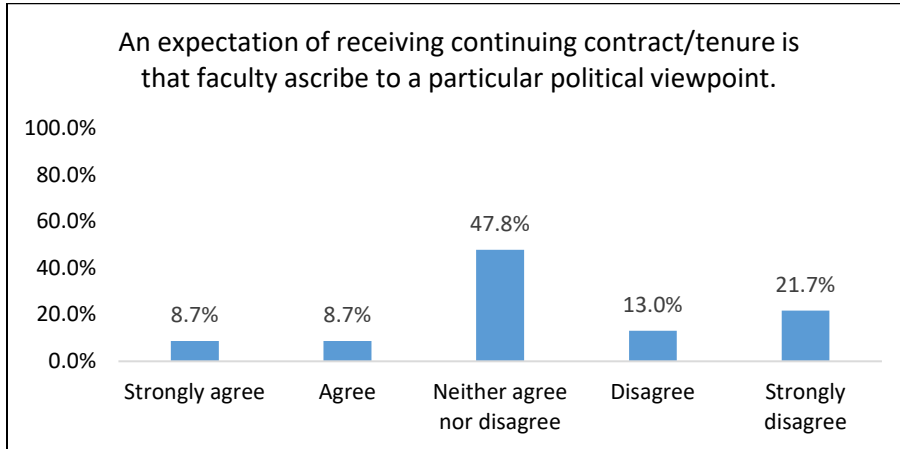


Figure 5.13. Question 13 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 46)

Figure 5.13 shows non-instructional employee responses (n = 46) to the question, “An expectation of receiving continuing contract/tenure is that faculty ascribe to a particular political viewpoint.” Almost 17 percent of non-instructional employee respondents agreed. About 35 percent of respondents disagreed that an expectation of continuing contract is ascribing to a particular political viewpoint. Almost 48 percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed.

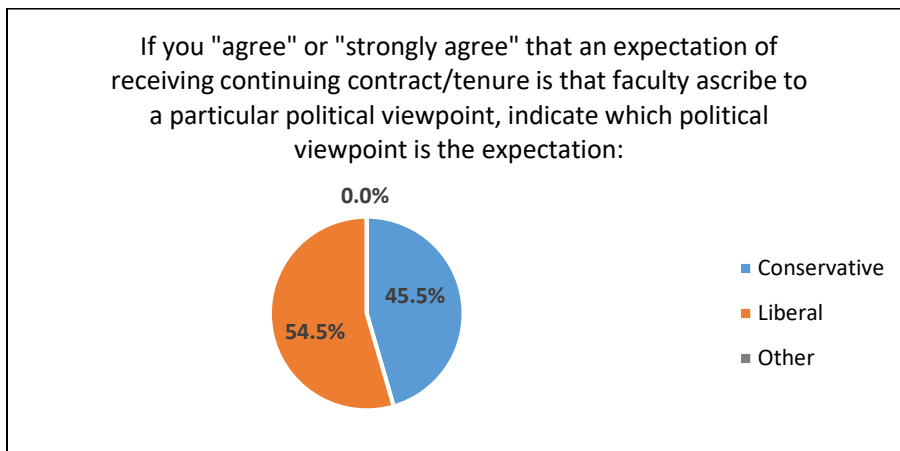


Figure 5.14. Question 14 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 11)

Figure 5.14 shows non-instructional employee responses (n = 11) to the question, “If you ‘agree’ or ‘strongly agree’ that an expectation of receiving continuing contract/tenure is that faculty ascribe to a particular political viewpoint, indicate which political viewpoint is the expectation.” About 55 percent of respondents indicated they believed liberal viewpoints are the expectation. Almost 45 percent of respondents indicated conservative viewpoints.

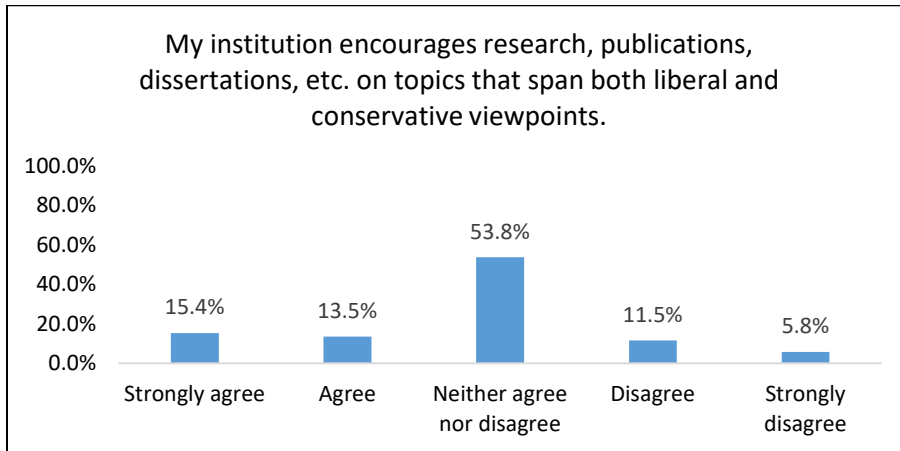


Figure 5.15. Question 15 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 52)

Figure 5.15 shows non-instructional employee responses (n = 52) to the question, “My institution encourages research, publications, dissertations, etc. on topics that span both liberal and conservative viewpoints.” Almost 29 percent of respondents agreed that their institutions encourage research that spans both liberal and conservative viewpoints. About 54 percent of respondents neither agreed nor disagreed, while about 17 percent of respondents disagreed.

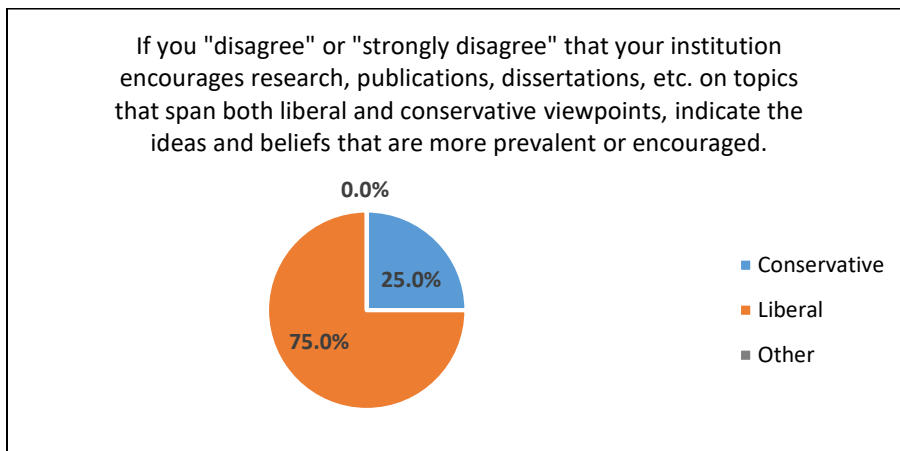


Figure 5.16. Question 16 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 8)

Liberal arts and humanities accounted for 20 percent of respondents. The remaining respondents taught in other subject areas.

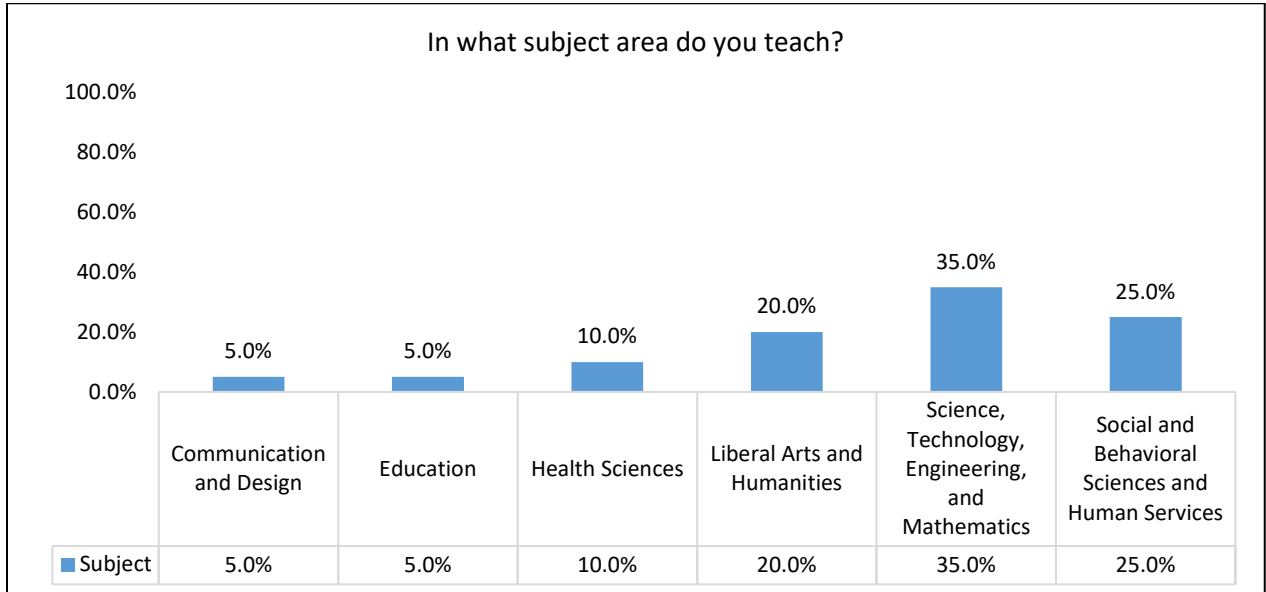


Figure 5.17. Question 17 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 20)

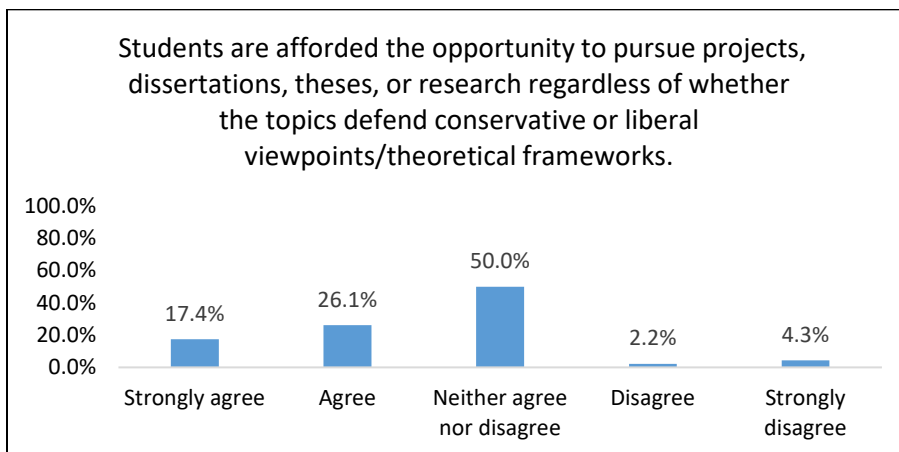


Figure 5.18. Question 18 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 46)

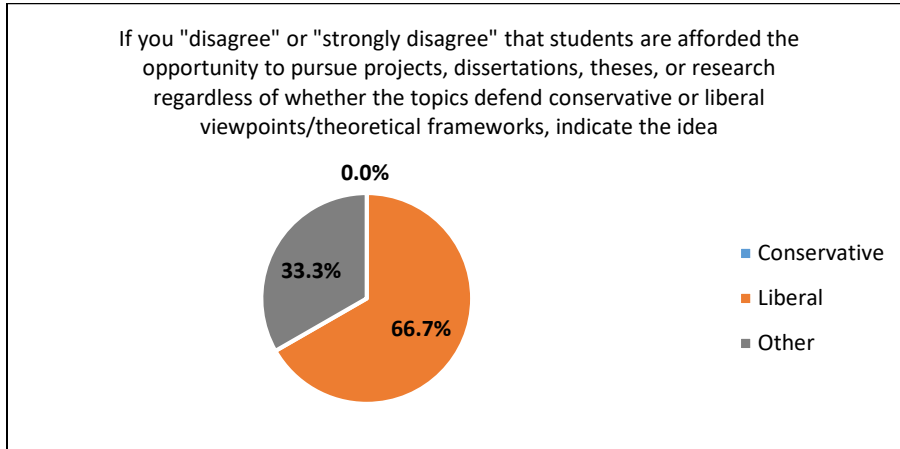


Figure 5.19. Question 19 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 3)

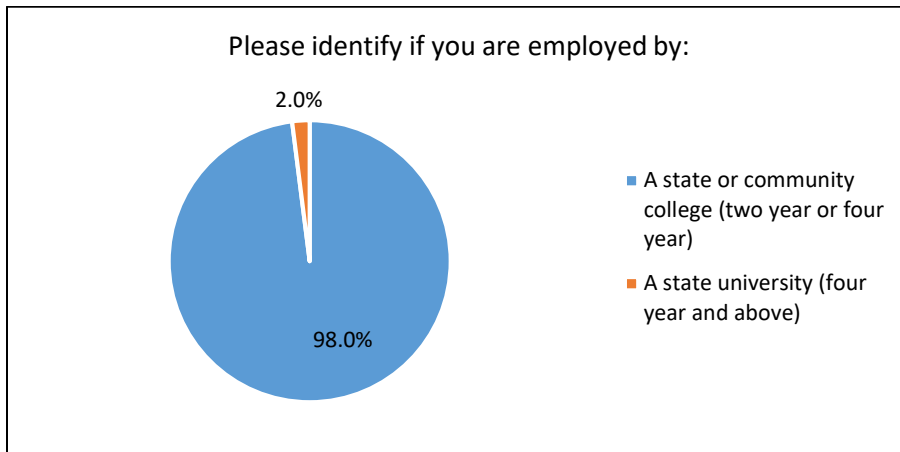


Figure 5.20. Question 20 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 3,625)

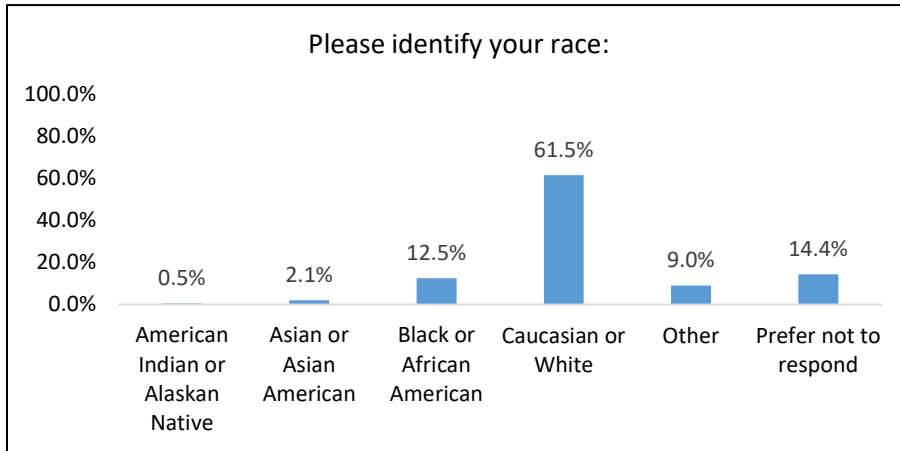


Figure 5.21. Question 21 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 3,622)

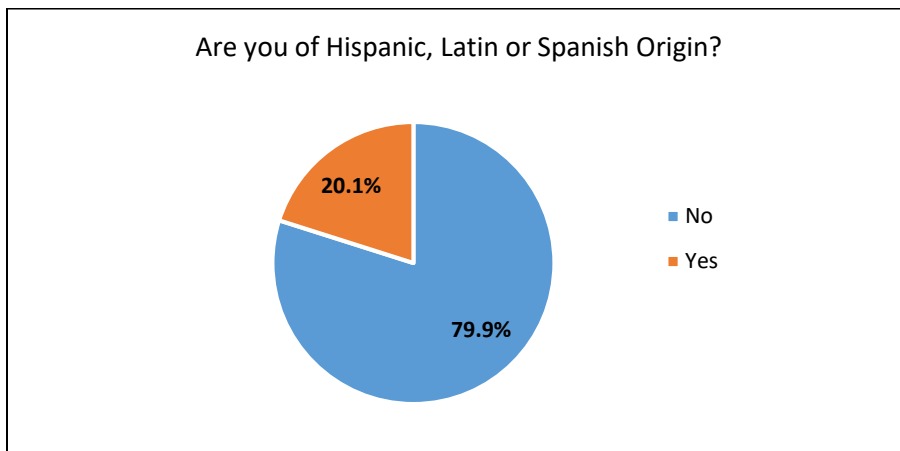


Figure 5.22. Question 22 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 3,487)

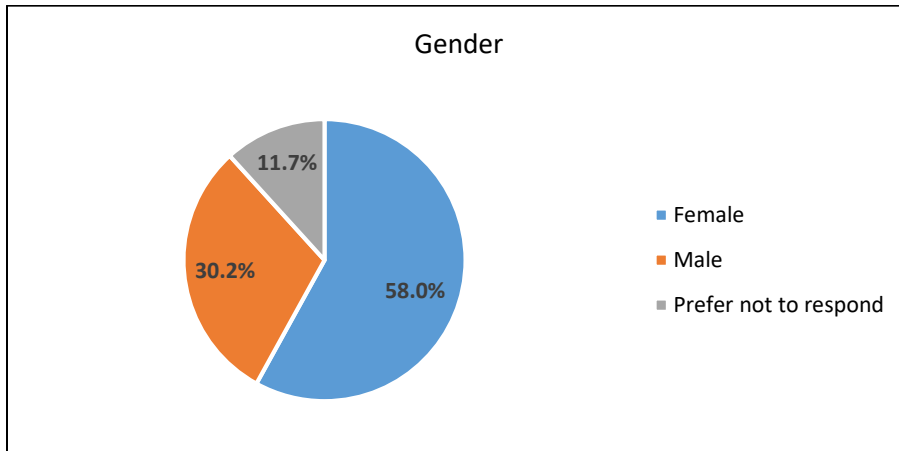


Figure 5.23. Question 23 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 3,621)

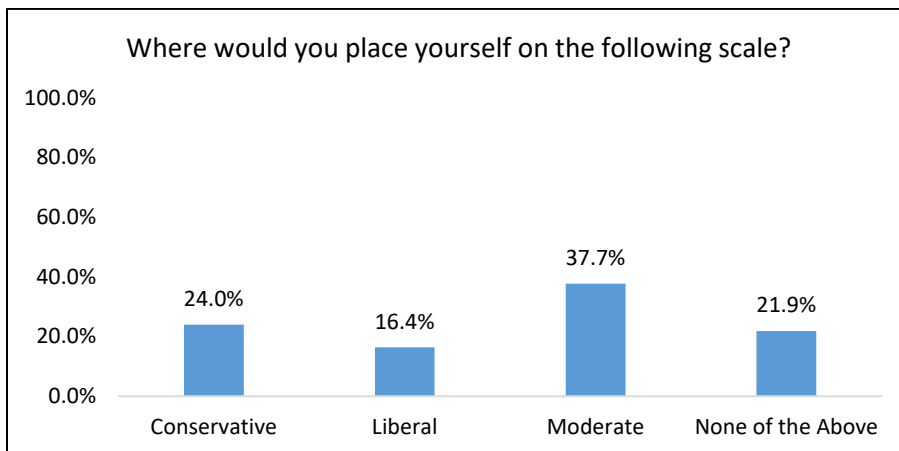


Figure 5.24. Question 24 Non-Instructional Employee Responses (n = 3,539)

SUBJECT: **Intellectual Freedom and Viewpoint Diversity - Survey Request**

During the 2021 legislative session, House Bill (HB) 233 amended sections 1001.03 and 1001.706, Florida Statutes, to define the terms “intellectual freedom and viewpoint diversity” and “shield.” The bill also added a requirement for Florida College System (FCS) and State University System (SUS) institutions to conduct an annual assessment of intellectual freedom and viewpoint diversity.

To that end, the Florida Department of Education, Division of Florida Colleges (DFC) requests your assistance in disseminating the instruments to students and employees, respectively. These instruments will assess the extent to which students and employees feel free to express their beliefs and viewpoints on campus and competing ideas are presented on campus.

Institutional Action Required

Instructions for disseminating the survey are provided in Appendix A. Please note the following institutional actions are required.

- As soon as possible – Institution identifies method of dissemination (Appendix A, Step 2)
- March 31, 2022 – Institution sends pre-survey notifications to students and employees, respectively, using DFC-provided language (Appendix A, Step 3).
- April 4, 2022 – Institution sends survey invitations to students and employees, respectively, using DFC-provided language (Appendix A, Step 4).
- April 7, 2022 – Institution sends survey reminders to students and employees, respectively, using DFC-provided language (Appendix A, Step 5).
- No later than April 15, 2022 – College president submits requested information on dissemination method and population size to FCsresearch@fldoe.org (Appendix A, Step 6).

**Intellectual Freedom and Viewpoint Diversity - Instructions for Survey
Dissemination**

Background

House Bill (HB) 233 amended sections (ss.) 1001.03 and 1001.706, Florida Statutes (F.S.), to define the terms “intellectual freedom and viewpoint diversity” and “shield.” The bill also added a requirement for Florida College System (FCS) and State University System (SUS) institutions to conduct an annual assessment of intellectual freedom and viewpoint diversity. The annual survey is required to be objective, nonpartisan and statistically valid. The instrument assesses the extent to which students, faculty and staff feel free to express their beliefs and viewpoints on campus and that competing ideas are presented on campus.

Public postsecondary colleges and universities have as their primary aim the preparation of students to become informed citizens of a democratic society. This requires students to cultivate the skills necessary to become intellectually autonomous, critical thinkers, and empathetic and ethical actors. This survey will inform state leaders with data and information about the extent to which students, faculty, and staff feel a part of a campus and intellectual environment conducive to achieving these aims.

Key Dates

Each FCS institution is responsible for assisting the Division of Florida Colleges (DFC) in disseminating the survey to its student body and employee populations in accordance with the following deadlines.

Pre-notification	<u>March 31, 2022</u> – Each institution sends pre-survey notifications to students and employees, respectively.
Survey	<u>April 4, 2022</u> – Each institution sends survey invitations to students and employees, respectively.
Reminders	<u>April 7, 2022</u> – Each institution sends survey reminders to students and employees, respectively.
Closing	<u>April 8, 2022</u> – Survey collectors close at 11:59 p.m. ET.
Certification	<u>No later than April 15, 2022</u> – College president submits requested information on dissemination method and population size to FCSresearch@fldoe.org .
Results	<u>By September 1, 2022</u> – The State Board of Education publishes the results annually, with the first report of the survey results published by September 1, 2022.

Instructions

Step 1: Retrieve survey links for your institution (as soon as possible)

The survey instruments have already been created for each FCS institution on DFC's web-based survey platform. On March 23, 2022, each chief academic officer and reports coordinator will receive an email from FCSresearch@fldoe.org containing two links to the institution-specific survey URLs: a student survey link and an employee survey link. Please note the survey collectors will not be open until April 4, 2022.

Institutions are requested to share the web-based collector link with their student and employee populations, respectively. **These should be separate notifications—one notification to all students with the student URL and one notification to all employees with the employee URL. Do not group students and employees in the same notification, as the survey URLs will be different.**

DFC will aggregate the responses and produce a system-wide report for the State Board of Education. Note: Chief academic officers and reports coordinators may contact FCSresearch@fldoe.org to request that survey links be re-sent, if needed.

Step 2: Determine method of dissemination (as soon as possible)

Each institution will use the most appropriate student/employee notification system to disseminate the survey link. The notification system must provide a distinct count of recipients and is anticipated to reach the full population. For consistency, institutions should select only one method of distribution per cohort type.

Step 3: Send pre-survey notifications (March 31, 2022)

On March 31, 2022, each institution will send students and employees a pre-survey notification using the text provided. Modify [student or employee] to reflect the population receiving the notification.
