## SECTI ON 6: Adul t Gener al Education Courses

The following programs and courses in Section 6 are uni que to Adult General Education and are ther ef ore not included in Section 3. Descriptions of these courses are as follows:

1. Adult Basic Education ( ABE ): This program and courses are designed for the student to increase basic literacy skills in mathematics, reading and language at the grade level equi val ency of $0-8.9$ to i mprove employability in the state's workforce, and transition to hi gher level s of educational attai nment and postsecondary trai ni ng.
2. Adult Secondary Education: Thi s termis used to describe prograns and courses desi gned for the student to recei ve high school credit that leads to the award of a hi gh school di pl ona or courses of instruction through which a student prepares to take the High School Equi val ency Test. Titles and descriptions are provi ded in $a, b$, and $c$ bel ow.
a. Adult Hi gh School: These courses are desi gned for the student to obtain credits upon completion of courses and passing of state mandated assessments necessary to qual ify for a standard hi gh school di ploma. Except as provided el sewhere in law, the graduation requirements for adults shall be the same as those for secondary students.

Instruction is of fered in general education subjects. Thi s offering is designed to accommodate the needs of students instructed in more than one hi gh school subject area who have withdrawn from the regular K-12 school system Students will meet the performance standards of each individual subject taken in this course. The student will attain a level of educational accompl ishment that meets his or her educational goal of successfully obtai ni ng an adult high school di ploma. The prograns shal l provide the opportunity for adults and incl ude pl anning and adjusting of courses to meet indi vi dual and small group needs, continui ng educational counsel ing and granting of credit on the basis of actual attai nment through self-paced, individual ized compet ency-based i nstruction.
b. Adult Hi gh School-Co-Enrolled: This programis designed for students currently enrolled in a K12 program who enroll in an Adult High School course(s) under special circunstances to earn credits needed for hi gh school graduation. Students are limited to two core curricula courses per year which are required for high school graduation. C. GED® These courses are designed to prepare adults at a 9.0 successfully pass the complete battery of the GED® subject area tests all four subtests, the student earns a state of Florida hi gh schoo
grade level or above to courses are offered in each of the four subtest subjects: (1) Reasoning through Language Arts (2) Social Studi es (3) Sci ence, and (4) Mathematical Reasoning. An additional course in this programis now available al so as described bel ow.

GEDR I nt egrat ed Comprehensi ve (GED-I Comprehensive): A course of studi es for students si mul taneousl y enrolled in GED Preparation course(s) and a Career and Technical Education program of st udy as part of a documented Career Pathways Program

Note: GED® Testing Requirement - The following requirement shall govern eligibility of candi dates who are not 18 years of age at the time of exami nation: According to rul es of the local school board, persons who are at least 16 years of age may be permitted to take the tests under extraordi nary ci rcunstances, Section 1003. 435(4), F. S.
4. Adult Engl ish for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)/Adult English as a Second Language (ESL): Thi s non- credit instructional program course is desi gned to provide adult English language I earners with the know edge and skills needed to commini cate effectivel y in English and impove their ability to enter the state's workforce and/or postsecondary education. The terms ESOL and ESL are i nt er changeable.
5. Citizenship: This program is designed to prepare students for success in the Naturalization process requi red for all who have United States Citizenship as a goal. The content includes prepar ation for the Citizenship Test, by studying U.S. Hi story, government, culture and symbol s with specific emphasis on rights and responsibilities under the Constitution of the United States of America.
6. Adult ESOL College and Career Readi ness: This programpourse is desi gned as a bridge course bet ween the Adult ESOL course and postsecondary education prograns.
7. Adult ESOL Literacy Skills: Thi s programpourse is for persons who wish to learn to commini cate in English, and who are in the begi nni ng stages of learning to read and write for the first time in any I anguage.
8. English Literacy for Career and Technical Education (ELCATE): Thi s progrand cour se is desi gned as a bridge course bet ween the Low-Intermedi ate level of the Adult ESO and the first level of Career and Techni cal educational courses.
9. Adults with Di sabilities: Thi s programis designed to provide speci alized adult gener al education for students with di sabilities who need intensive, ongoing support. I nstruction in literacy, workrel ated behavi ors, and daily living skills are provided that will enable the student to participate in home and comminity activities and reach desi red personal goal s including work.
10. Appl ied Academics for Adult Education: Thi s programis desi gned for the st udent who may or may not have a high school di plom, is at a 9.0 or above grade level, and is in need of academic skills necessary to pursue postsecondary education or trai ni ng, or continued empl oyment.
