## **APPENDIX D**

### INSERVICE EDUCATION COMPONENT NUMBER

The component number is a unique eight-digit number assigned by the district to each individual component and should remain the same during the life of the component. It is composed of the following codes:

<u>POSITION 1</u>: <u>FUNCTION</u> - A one-digit code (1-8) which identifies the primary function which is the principal focus of the component.

INSTRUCTION: Components, used with Function Numbers 1 or 5, which focus on activities which deal directly with the teaching of pupils or with pupil-teacher interaction.

BASIC PROGRAMS: Basic programs include those instructional programs in grades KG-12 which are not part of the district or agency program in Exceptional Student Education, Vocational-Technical Education or Adult General Education.
