### Comprehensive Management Information System Automated Student Reporting Format

#### 1998-99 Statewide Assessment Program

- 1. For survey period 8, use this format to submit <u>one</u> Statewide Assessment Program for every fourth and eighth grade student enrolled in your district during the spring testing period even if the student transferred out of the district prior to the end of the school year. If a fourth or eighth grade student did not take the test in your district, only data format items 1-8, 23, 27 and 28 are required. For test information items 11-22 and 24-26 enter "0's" (zeroes).
- 2. SCHOOL NUMBER, CURRENT ENROLLMENT: Use the school number for the last school in which the student was enrolled in your district during the regular 180-day school year.
- 3. Grade Level is the grade level the student was in at the time the test was administered.
- 4. Subtest scores in reading and mathematics are to be submitted according to the norm-referenced test given. Refer to the attached norm-referenced test information guide for details of subtest scores requested for each norm-referenced test.
- 5. TEST DATE: Provide the midpoint (month, day, year) of the test administration period, for the district. This data element will be used for pretest and posttest dates for the Compensatory Project Evaluation, Spring testing for the norm-referenced test and for English language proficiency assessment.
- 6. KEY FIELDS: The key fields for this format are item numbers 1, 4, 5 and 6. If a key field needs to be changed, the record must be deleted and re-submitted as an add.
