F	<p>Homeless Adult.</p> <p>An individual lacking a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence as well as an individual having a primary nighttime residence that is (1) a supervised publicly or privately operated shelter designed to provide temporary living accommodations to include, but not limited to, welfare hotels, congregate shelters and transitional housing for mentally ill; (2) an institution that provides a temporary residence for individuals intended to be institutionalized; or (3) a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings. Individuals imprisoned or otherwise detained pursuant to an Act of the Congress or a state law are not, by definition, included.</p>		
G	<p>Public Assistance.</p> <p>An individual receiving financial assistance from federal, state and/or local programs, such as aid for dependent children, senior citizens assistance, general assistance and aid to the blind or totally disabled. Unless social security recipients are also receiving old-age assistance or other forms of public assistance, they should not be included in this category.</p>
