3. For reporting period 9 the universe is determined by this format. Records should be submitted only for students who have a current FSP, IEP or EP as of December 1 of the reporting year. Students do not have to be in attendance but must be in membership to be counted.
4. YEAR: For reporting periods 1-4 or 9 this field will contain the fiscal year. For reporting period 5 this field will contain school year.
5. EXCEPTIONAL STUDENT, POSTSCHOOL OUTCOME AREA: For reporting period 5, enter the appropriate anticipated service codes if the student has exited the school system. If the student will continue next school year, put Z's in the data item field.
6. EXCEPTIONAL STUDENT, DISMISSAL DATE: Report the most recent Exceptional Student, Dismissal Date in Survey 5 for any student who has exited all Exceptional programs during the school year and is no longer receiving special education and related services.
7. TIME, TOTAL SCHOOL WEEK AND TIME WITH NON-DISABLED PEERS are reported only in Surveys 2 and 9. For all other surveys, z-fill the fields.
8. EXCEPTIONAL STUDENT, IDEA EDUCATIONAL ENVIRONMENTS: Report only in Survey 9. For all other Surveys, Z-fill the field.
9. KEY FIELDS: The key fields for this format are item numbers 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5. If a key field needs to be changed, the record must be deleted and re-submitted as an add.
